Day 1: Tue, Apr 09 — HONOLULU. Depart Honolulu.

Day 2: Wed, Apr 10 — TOKYO, JAPAN. Arrive Tokyo. After entry formalities, transfer by coach to hotel in Tokyo. KEIO PLAZA HOTEL TOKYO (3 Nights)

Day 3: Thur, Apr 11 — TOKYO. After a sumptuous buffet breakfast, embark on a full day of discovery! First visit Meiji Shrine, the Shinto shrine dedicated to the deified spirits of the Emperor Meiji and his wife, Empress Shoken. Then visit the visually stimulating Harajuku Shopping District. Next, a hands-on Sushi Making Session will yield your delicious lunch. After lunch, take a tour of the **Fukagawa Edo** Museum, which vividly illustrates the past of Tokyo (known as Edo until 1869) through its exhibits. Visitors are able to experience and learn about various aspects of what life was like during the Edo period. Experience a traditional Japanese Tea Ceremony. Lastly, visit Ameyoko, a busy market street along the Yamanote Line tracks between Okachimachi and Ueno Stations. The name "Ameyoko" is a short form for "Ameya Yokocho" (candy store alley), as candies were traditionally sold there. Alternatively, "Ame" also stands for "America", because a lot of American products used to be available there when the street was the site of a black market in the years following World War II. Today, various products such as clothes, bags, cosmetics, fresh fish, dried food, and spices are sold along Ameyoko. Return to the hotel for an evening of leisure. Explore the numerous dining options available to you around the hotel. (B, L)

Day 4: Fri, Apr 12 — TOKYO. Day at Leisure. Enjoy shopping and dining in the bustling Shinjuku area. (B)

Day 5: Sat, Apr 13 — TOKYO (YOKOHAMA) — EMBARK RIVIERA. After a delicious breakfast at the hotel, depart the hotel for Yokohama. We start our day visiting Sankeien Garden — a spacious Japanese-style garden in southern Yokohama which exhibits a number of historic buildings from across Japan. There is a pond, small rivers, flowers, and wonderful strolling trails that make you think you are in Kyoto rather than Yokohama. Next, explore the Cup Noodle Museum and learn about the history of this dorm room favorite of students worldwide. Get the chance to make your own personal Cup Noodle. What a great memento of your trip! Have lunch in Yokohama's China Town. Free time after lunch for some shopping before transferring to the pier for embarkation on the Oceania Riviera. Depart 7:00 pm. (B, L, D)

Day 6: Sun, Apr 14 — SHIMIZU, JAPAN. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 2:00 pm. In the shadow of Mount Fuji, Shimizu is one of the most beautiful ports in Japan. Walk through the pine groves of Miho, home to a 650-year-old Japanese black pine, or enjoy spectacular views of Mount Fuji from the lush, forested hill of Nihondaira. Take in the seascapes on a bay cruise, or learn of undersea delights at Japan's first sushi museum. For a historic angle, get a glimpse at feudal life in Japan in 200 BC at the archaeological site of Toro. (B. L. D)

Day 7: Mon, Apr 15 — OSAKA, JAPAN. Arrive 9:00 am. Depart 8:00 pm. Prior to the 8th century Nara period, the capital of Japan moved with each new emperor, and Osaka was one of those earliest capitals, then known as Naniwa. During the Edo period, Osaka grew into a commercial center of the rice trade and became known as "the nation's kitchen," a moniker now applied because of the city's reputation for cuisine so good that, as the saying goes, people go broke buying it. A vibrant arts culture also developed in the 17th century, including the famous kabuki and bunraku theaters that can still be seen today. Devastated during World War II, Osaka reemerged as a maze of bridges and skyscrapers flanking a moated castle that stands in the city center as a reminder of a regal past. The skyline gains further allure from the illumination of several Ferris wheels, unique status symbols of modern Japanese cities. (B, L, D)

Day 8: Tue, Apr 16 — KOCHI, JAPAN. Arrive 8:00 am. Depart 5:00 pm. Not the typical Japanese city, small and compact Kochi has gained a well-deserved reputation for its exuberant, easy-going spirit and vibrant food scene. The city is the birthplace of the legendary samurai Sakamoto Ryoma, who created an alliance that eventually brought down the Tokugawa shogunate and is now commemorated in a memorial museum. In the city center, don't miss the well-preserved hilltop Kochi Castle to explore the grounds where the city was established in 1601. You might continue your downtown explorations at one of the many pedestrian shopping arcades or at a restaurant to try Kochi's most famous dish — katsuo-no-tataki, a savory dish of grilled, ponzu-marinated skipjack tuna, or bonito fish. (B, L, D)

Day 9: Wed, Apr 17 — CRUISING THE EAST CHINA SEA. (B, L, D)

Day 10: Thur, Apr 18 — ISHIGAKI, JAPAN. Arrive 11:00 am. Depart 8:00 pm. Discover this remote and picturesque island's lush mountains, beautiful beaches and magnificent coral reef from island viewpoints. See the native palm forest and the lavishly decorated Chinese tomb. Step back in time and travel to the tiny island of Taketomi-jima with its treasured red-tile-roofed town where rural island heritage, including ox carts, is vividly alive. (B, L, D)

Day 11: Fri, Apr 19 — TAIPEI (KEELUNG), TAIWAN. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 6:00 pm. On this fascinating island visit the world's tallest building, the Chiang Kai Shek Memorial, the fabulous Palace Museum's vast collection of Chinese art and the lovely Lungshan Temple. Explore lovely Keelung's historic sites and Yeliu Park's astonishing rock formations. (B, L, D)

Day 12: Sat, Apr 20 — KAOHSIUNG, TAIWAN. Arrive 9:00 am. Depart 6:00 pm. The canal-like Love River flows through the heart of this wonderfully modern city, and a boat ride along its shores reveals Kaohsiung's beauty. The former British Consulate, built in 1865, is a historic landmark juxtaposed with more modern sites such as the Kaohsiung Museum of Fine Arts, known for its contemporary sculptures. (B, L, D)

Day 13: Sun, Apr 21 — HONG KONG, CHINA. Arrive 1:00 pm. Overnight in Port. Experience old and new Hong Kong with its ultra-modern high-rise buildings beside street markets and lovely temples. Visit the

boat people in Aberdeen and shop in Stanley Market or stroll through the bustling Temple Street night market. Visit Hollywood Road with its temple and antique shops or take a junk cruise and explore the magnificent bay. Travel to the New Territories to see family shrines, the wishing tree and the preserved wetlands. Or visit Lantau Island and the Po Lin Monastery with its giant Buddha statue. (B, L, D)

Day 14: Mon, Apr 22 — HONG KONG, CHINA. Depart 6:00 pm. (B, L, D)

Day 15: Tue, Apr 23 — CRUISING THE SOUTH CHINA SEA. (B, L, D)

Day 16: Wed, Apr 24 – NHA TRANG, VIETNAM. Arrive 9:00 am. Depart 5:00 pm. Discover this bustling resort town, renowned for its turquoise waters and yellow sand beaches. See its grand colonial buildings and stroll across a bridge to a fishing village alive with trawlers and junks. Visit the celebrated Cham Towers of Po Nagar, a spot revered by Buddhists. In the countryside, experience rural life in Vietnam today. (B, L, D)

Day 17: Thur, Apr 25 — SAIGON (HO CHI MINH CITY), VIETNAM. Arrive 11:00 am. Overnight in Port. Discover the rich heritage of Saigon and the rural Mekong Delta. See the city's lovely pagodas, colonial architecture and broad boulevards. Ride a local pedicab through the bustling streets; visit the vibrant markets, Chinatown and the fascinating Cu Chi tunnels. Explore the lush countryside of farms, rice paddies and villages with a cruise on the Mekong. (B, L, D)

Day 18: Fri, Apr 26 — SAIGON (HO CHI MINH CITY), VIETNAM. Depart $3:00 \, \text{pm}$. (B, L, D)

Day 19: Sat, Apr 27 — CRUISING THE SOUTH CHINA SEA. (B, L, D)

Day 20: Sun, Apr 28 — SINGAPORE, SINGAPORE — DISEMBARK RIVIERA. Arrive 7:00 am. Disembark Riviera. Upon disembarkation at the Singapore pier, join your local guide and visit Little India, Sultan Mosque, Arab Street, Merlion Park, Old Parliament House (outside), statues of Sir Stamford Raffle, and Esplanade (outside). After lunch, visit Sentosa Island and S.E.A. Aquarium. Enjoy dinner at a local restaurant before returning to the hotel. PARK HOTEL ALEXANDRA or Similar (2 Nights) (B, L, D)

Day 21: Mon, Apr 29 — SINGAPORE. Enjoy breakfast at the hotel. Start the day with a visit to the **Singapore Zoo**. After lunch, tour **Gardens by the Bay** (including entry into the cool house). For dinner, explore a local **Hawker's Market** and have a "**Crazy Rich Asians" experience** of your own. Return to the hotel for the evening. (B, L)

Day 22: Tue, Apr 30 — SINGAPORE — HONOLULU. After breakfast, transfer to the airport for the flight home. Depart Singapore. Arrive Honolulu. Aloha and Welcome Home! (B)
