Day 1: Sat, Mar 16 — HONOLULU. Depart Honolulu.

Day 2: Sun, Mar 17 — TOKYO, JAPAN. Arrive Tokyo. After entry formalities, transfer by coach to hotel in Tokyo. KEIO PLAZA HOTEL TOKYO (3 Nights)

Day 3: Mon, Mar 18 — TOKYO. After a sumptuous buffet breakfast, embark on a full day of discovery! First visit Meiji Shrine, the Shinto shrine dedicated to the deified spirits of the Emperor Meiji and his wife, Empress Shoken. Then visit the visually stimulating Harajuku Shopping District. Next, a hands-on Sushi Making Session will yield your delicious lunch. After lunch, take a tour of the Fukagawa Edo Museum, which vividly illustrates the past of Tokyo (known as Edo until 1869) through its exhibits. Visitors are able to experience and learn about various aspects of what life was like during the Edo period. Lastly, visit Ameyoko, a busy market street along the Yamanote Line tracks between Okachimachi and Ueno Stations. The name "Ameyoko" is a short form for "Ameya Yokocho" (candy store alley), as candies were traditionally sold there. Alternatively, "Ame" also stands for "America", because a lot of American products used to be available there when the street was the site of a black market in the years following World War II. Today, various products such as clothes, bags, cosmetics, fresh fish, dried food, and spices are sold along Ameyoko. Return to the hotel for an evening of leisure. Explore the numerous dining options available to you around the hotel. (B, L)

Day 4: Tue, Mar 19 – TOKYO. Day at Leisure. Enjoy shopping and dining in the bustling Shinjuku area. (B)

Day 5: Wed, Mar 20 — TOKYO (YOKOHAMA) — EMBARK RIVIERA. After a delicious breakfast at the hotel, depart the hotel for Yokohama. We start our day visiting **Sankeien Garden** — a spacious Japanese-style garden in southern Yokohama which exhibits a number of historic buildings from across Japan. There is a pond, small rivers, flowers, and wonderful strolling trails that make you think you are in Kyoto rather than Yokohama. Next, explore the **Cup Noodle Museum** and learn about the history of this dorm room favorite of students worldwide. Get the chance to make your own personal Cup Noodle. What a great memento of your trip! Have lunch in **Yokohama's China Town**. Free time after lunch for some shopping before transferring to the pier for embarkation on the Oceania Riviera. Depart 5:00 pm. (B, L, D)

Day 6: Thur, Mar 21 — NAGOYA, JAPAN. Arrive 8:30 am. Depart 5:00 pm. A center of modern commerce, yet steeped in ancient history; visit the castle in the center of town, its golden orca statues are a symbol of the city. Explore Toyota's Museum of Technology and tour the Noritake factory, where bargains on the fine china can be found. (B, L, D)

Day 7: Fri, Mar 22 — KOCHI, JAPAN. Arrive 9:00 am. Depart 5:00 pm. Not the typical Japanese city, small and compact Kochi has gained a well-deserved reputation for its exuberant, easy-going spirit and vibrant food scene. The city is the birthplace of the legendary samurai Sakamoto Ryoma, who created an alliance that eventually brought down the Tokugawa shogunate and is now commemorated in a memorial museum. In the city center, don't miss the well-preserved hilltop Kochi Castle to explore the grounds where the city was established in 1601. You might continue your downtown explorations at one of the many pedestrian shopping arcades or at a restaurant to try Kochi's most famous dish — katsuo-no-tataki, a savory dish of grilled, ponzu-marinated skipjack tuna, or bonito fish. (B, L, D)

Day 8: Sat, Mar 23 — KAGOSHIMA, JAPAN. Arrive 10:00 am. Depart 6:30 pm. Visit the exquisite Iso-Teien Garden and its villa, built in 1660, and enjoy its gorgeous views before a short ferry ride to smoking Sakurajima for a close-up view of the volcano and its lava fields. Or journey into the countryside to Chiran and its well-preserved streets lined with samurai homes. Enjoy the beautiful landscape of Lake Ikeda and the stunning vistas of the Satsuma Peninsula. (B, L, D)

Day 9: Sun, Mar 24 — NAGASAKI, JAPAN. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 7:00 pm. Discover remnants of old Nagasaki beside the modern city. Visit the Peace Park and Atomic Bomb Museum. Or travel to Arita, home of magnificent Japanese ceramics, and tour famous Kakiemon Kiln, which continues a 400-year-old tradition. Experience feudal Japan and the natural wonders of Shimabara Peninsula with its volcanoes and hot springs. (B, L, D)

Day 10: Mon, Mar 25 – BUSAN, SOUTH KOREA – CRUISING THE KANMON STRAIT. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 4:00 pm. From trendy cafes and famous fish markets to sacred temples and traditional tea ceremonies, Busan, the second largest city in South Korea is bursting with flavors and culture. Take a walk in the relaxing Yongdusan Park while admiring the various species of trees and a view of the Busan Tower. At the Hongbeopsa farming temple, explore the renowned large Buddha statues at the Main Buddha Hall while walking along a water lily path, or experience a traditional Korean tea ceremony conducted by one of their monks. (B, L, D)

Day 11: Tue, Mar 26 – CRUISING THE KANMON STRAIT – HIROSHIMA, JAPAN. Arrive 9:30 am. Depart 9:30 pm. Visit the skeletal A-Bomb Dome, the Peace Memorial Park and Museum, and the statue dedicated to the children who died after the atomic bomb was dropped on this city in 1945. Stroll through beautifully landscaped Hiroshima Gardens, visit the rebuilt Hiroshima Castle or journey to the exquisite sacred island of Miyajima and see the extraordinary Itsukushima Shrine. (B, L, D)

Day 12: Wed, Mar 27 – BEPPU, JAPAN. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 5:00 pm. Backed by steep hills and mountains on the eastern coast of Kyushu Island, Beppu is known as Japan's top hot spring resort city. Home to more than 2,000 hot springs, this picturesque city gives you a chance to experience its hot springs, mud baths, steam baths and even traditional Japanese black sand baths. To top it off, eight unique hot springs, collectively named Onsen Hells, offer entertainingly distinctive attractions. On chilly days, visitors are treated to the otherworldly view of steam rising throughout the city. Since Beppu is famously popular within Japan as a resort getaway, it's an ideal place to rub elbows with Japanese travelers. (B, L, D)

Day 14: Fri, Mar 29 — KYOTO (KOBE), JAPAN. Arrive 7:00 am. Overnight in Port. Visit the breathtaking temples and shrines of Japan's old imperial capital, Kyoto, or explore ancient Nara, the cradle of Japanese arts, literature and crafts, with its magnificent shrines and temples that predate Kyoto's. Stroll through Nara Park, famed for its deer and impressive Kasuga Grand Shrine. Then travel on to Osaka and its famed castle. In Kobe, visit historic Himeji Castle, a huge edifice built entirely of wood and tile. (B, L, D)

Day 15: Sat, Mar 30 — KYOTO (KOBE), JAPAN. Depart 4:00 pm. (B, L, D)

Day 16: Sun, Mar 31 – SHIMIZU, JAPAN. Arrive 10:30 am. Depart 8:30 pm. In the shadow of Mount Fuji, Shimizu is one of the most beautiful ports in Japan. Walk through the pine groves of Miho, home to a 650-year-old Japanese black pine, or enjoy spectacular views of Mount Fuji from the lush, forested hill of Nihondaira. Take in the seascapes on a bay cruise, or learn of undersea delights at Japan's first sushi museum. For a historic angle, get a glimpse at feudal life in Japan in 200 BC at the archaeological site of Toro. (B, L, D)

Day 17: Mon, Apr 01 — TOKYO (YOKOHAMA), JAPAN — DISEMBARK RIVIERA — HONOLULU. Arrive 7:00 am. Disembark Riviera. After disembarkation, visit the **Tsukiji Outer Market**. Although the Inner Market (and live auctions) have relocated, the Outer Market remains — full of a mixture of wholesale and retail shops along with numerous restaurants. Seafood fresh from the auction block are available for purchase. After lunch, enjoy the beautiful Cherry Blossoms in full bloom along Sumida River. Travel to **Asakusa**, the center of Tokyo's shitamachi (literally "low city") districts, where an atmosphere of the Tokyo of past decades survives. Asakusa's main attraction is **Sensoji**, a very popular Buddhist temple built in the 7th century. The temple is approached via the **Nakamise**, a shopping street that has been providing temple visitors with a variety of traditional local snacks and tourist souvenirs for centuries. Experience a **traditional Japanese Tea Ceremony** before transferring to the airport for the flight home. Depart Tokyo and arrive Honolulu the same day. Aloha and Welcome Home! (B)
