CRUISE HIGHLIGHTS: Ketchikan • Endicott Arm & Dawes Glacier • Juneau • Skagway • Victoria B.C.

ENDICOTT ARM & DAWES GLACIER: This narrow fjord is located approximately 50 miles southeast of Juneau and is part of the Tracy Arm-Fords Terror Wilderness area. Breathtaking Endicott Arm extends over 30 miles long, with nearly one-fifth of its area covered in ice. At the head of the fjord, tidewater glaciers, such as the Dawes Glacier, regularly expel enormous chunks of ice into the waters below in a magnificent process known as calving. During the summer when Princess ships visit, icebergs float along the surface of the glistening water in an array of sizes, from just a few inches up to three stories wide.

Protected within the Tongass National Forest, Endicott Arm is a haven for wildlife. Black and brown bears, deer, wolves, harbor seals, mountain goats, and a variety of seabirds have been spotted in the area.

As you glide through the pristine fjord, you'll first pass by a lush forest where a number of beautiful waterfalls cascade down, and then you'll be treated to views of snowcapped mountains and blue-tinged glaciers more spectacular than you could ever imagine.

Day 1: Sat — HONOLULU — SEATTLE. Depart Honolulu via Hawaiian Airlines flt #22 at 1:10 pm. Arrive in Seattle at 9:55 pm. Transfer to the airport hotel. RADISSON HOTEL SEATTLE AIRPORT (1 Night)

Day 2: Sun — SEATTLE — EMBARK DISCOVERY PRINCESS. After enjoying breakfast at the hotel, transfer to the Port of Seattle. Board the luxurious DISCOVERY PRINCESS. Enjoy the Sail Away Party! (Light B, D)

Day 3: Mon — AT SEA. Enjoy a scenic day at sea as you explore your ship. (B, L, D)

Day 4: Tue — KETCHIKAN, ALASKA. Arrive 6:30 am. Depart 3:00 pm. Ketchikan is known as **Alaska's "First City"** because it's the first major community travelers come to as they journey north. Located on an island, Ketchikan **began life as an Indian fishing camp**. The name Ketchikan comes from a **Tlingit phrase that means "eagle with spread-out wings,"** a reference to a waterfall near town. In the early 1900s, when gold was Alaska's claim to fame, fishing and timber industries were established in Ketchikan. The growth of these industries helped make this Inside Passage port Alaska's fourth-largest city. Visitors to Ketchikan will be intrigued by its rich Native heritage, which includes the **world's oldest collection of totem poles** at Totem Heritage Center. The Haida, Tlingit, and Tsimshian are all a part of the city's colorful history. Ketchikan, with its **abundance of salmon**, is also a sportfishing paradise. Sightseers will be impressed with both the scenic town and its surroundings, especially Misty Fjords National Monument. (B, L, D)

Day 5: Wed — ENDICOTT ARM AND DAWES GLACIER (SCENIC CRUISING). Arrive 5:00 am. Depart 9:00 am. JUNEAU, ALASKA. Arrive 12:30 pm. Depart 9:00 pm. In 1880, it was slow going for Joe Juneau and Richard Harris as they searched for gold with the help of Native guides. After climbing mountains, forging streams and facing countless difficulties, they found nuggets "as large as beans." From their discovery came **three of the largest gold mines in the world**. By the end of WWII, more than \$150 million in gold had been mined. Eventually the mines closed, but the town Joe Juneau founded became the **capital of Alaska** and the business of gold was replaced by the business of government. Some 30,000 people live in Juneau. Its total area makes it one of the biggest towns, in size, in the world. Only Kiruna, Sweden, and Sitka, Alaska, exceed Juneau's 3,248 square miles. Today Juneau is famous not only for gold and government but also for its breathtakingly beautiful glaciers and stunning views of both water and mountains. (B, L, D)

Day 6: Thur — SKAGWAY, ALASKA. Arrive 6:00 am. Depart 5:00 pm. Skagway was the **gateway to the gold fields** for the thousands who flocked to Alaska and the Yukon with the hope of striking it rich. Skagway may have boasted the shortest route to the Klondike, but it wasn't the easiest. Over 100 years ago, the White Pass route through the Coast Mountains and the shorter but steeper Chilkoot Trail were used by countless stampeders. Many a would-be miner perished on the treacherous Chilkoot Trail. The gold rush was a boon and **by 1898, Skagway was Alaska's largest town** with a population of about 20,000. Hotels, saloons, dance halls and gambling houses prospered. But when the gold yield dwindled in 1900, so did the population as miners quickly shifted to new finds in Nome. Today, Skagway has less than 1,000 residents. It still retains the flavor of the gold rush era. (B, L, D)

Day 7: Fri — AT SEA. Enjoy a scenic day at sea as you explore your ship. (B, L, D)

Day 8: Sat — VICTORIA, BRITISH COLUMBIA. Arrive 7:00 pm. Depart 11:59 pm. Victoria **exudes old-world charm** and fragrant, colorful flowers are everywhere. Founded in 1843 by James Douglas of the Hudson's Bay Company, the city was **first known as Fort Victoria**. By 1848, Vancouver Island was a British colony and Victoria was its capital. In 1858, Victoria was a tent city and the base for some 25,000 prospectors on their way to the Fraser River gold fields. When Vancouver Island was incorporated with mainland British Columbia in 1868, Victoria **became the capital of the entire province**. Although it's a port city, Victoria is not as industrially oriented as Vancouver. The harbors, especially Inner Harbour, are dotted with pleasure craft, ferries and floatplanes. The city is renowned for its **beautiful gardens, charming houses, and very British feel**. (B, L, D)

Day 9: Sun — DISEMBARK DISCOVERY PRINCESS — SEATTLE — HONOLULU. Disembark the DISCOVERY PRINCESS. **Half-day city tour**. A stop at **Pike Place Market** on the way to the airport. Depart Seattle via Hawaiian Airlines flt #633 at 3:55 pm and arrive in Honolulu at 7:07 pm. Aloha and welcome home! (B)
