Day 1: Sun, Mar 16 — HONOLULU. Depart Honolulu via Japan Airlines flt #73 at 11:55 am.

**Day 2: Mon, Mar 17** — TOKYO. Arrive at the Haneda International Airport at 3:55 pm. After entry formalities, transfer by coach to your hotel in Maihama. Enjoy a buffet dinner at the hotel. SHERATON GRANDE TOKYO BAY HOTEL (3 Nights) (D)

**Day 3: Tue, Mar 18** — TOKYO DISNEYLAND. After a sumptuous Japanese/Western buffet breakfast, enjoy a full day at **Tokyo Disneyland!** Group Members will transfer to the Resort together. Group Members will return to the hotel on their own using the Disney Resort Line. (B)

**Day 4: Wed, Mar 19** – TOKYO DISNEYSEA. After breakfast, transfer to DisneySea. **Tokyo DisneySea** opened on September 4, 2001 as the only Disney Park themed to the sea. Group Members will transfer to the resort together. Group Members will return to the hotel on their own using the Disney Resort Line. (B)

\*Baggage will be sent from Tokyo to Osaka, skipping Hakone. Prepare an overnight bag for one night.

**Day 5: Thur, Mar 20** – TOKYO – OSHINO – HAKONE. After breakfast, depart Tokyo for Hakone. Visit **Oshino Hakkai**, a set of eight ponds located in the Fuji Five Lake Region. The eight ponds are fed by melting snow from the nearby slopes of Mt. Fuji. The melted snow filtered down through porous layers of lava for 80 years, resulting in a very clear spring water that is revered by the locals. Next to one pond, visitors can drink the cool water straight from the source. Continue to Hakone where much of the area is considered an active volcanic zone since its creation from eruption of Mt. Hakone some 3,000 years ago. Enjoy a **boat ride on the beautiful Lake Ashi**. Transfer to the hotel for dinner. The onsen hot springs – which are divided for men and women – allow you to **enjoy the onsens** whether indoors or outdoors. The high-quality service and facilities are sure to become some of your fondest memories of your visit to Japan. HAKONE SENGOKUHARA PRINCE HOTEL (1 Night) (B, L, D)

**Day 6: Fri, Mar 21** — HAKONE — KYOTO — OSAKA. After breakfast, board your waiting coach and travel to the Odawara Station. Board your **Shinkansen Bullet Train** for your ride to Kyoto Train Station. Enjoy a bento lunch onboard. Upon arrival in Kyoto, embark on a half day of sightseeing beginning with a visit to **Toei Kyoto Studio Park**, the only theme park in Japan where you can observe the filming of jidaigeki (period dramas) films usually set during the Edo period (1603—1868). You can walk freely around the Toei Studio Film Set, which depicts a street from the Edo period, and is used to shoot more than 200 films per year. Next visit **Kinkakuji Temple (Golden Pavilion)**, a Zen Temple whose top two floors are completely covered in gold leaf. Transfer to the hotel in Osaka. The evening is at your leisure. The Local Guide will have many suggestions for dinner and shopping. HILTON OSAKA (2 Nights) (B, L)





**Day 7: Sat, Mar 22** – OSAKA. After breakfast start the day with a visit to **Universal Studios Japan** by chartered coach. Enjoy a full day of attractions and entertainment including the all new "The Wizarding World of Harry Potter." Later visit **Osaka Aquarium (Kaiyukan)**, one of the largest aquariums in the world, famous for its gigantic whale sharks! This evening, visit **Tempozan Marketplace**. Enjoy the numerous shops, restaurants, amusement and gourmet theme park that can be found there, before returning to the hotel for an evening of leisure. (B)

**Day 8: Sun, Mar 23** — OSAKA — HONOLULU. After breakfast, depart the hotel for a day of shopping! Begin at **Kuromon Ichiba Market**, a lively covered market which stretches for 580 meters in Osaka's Chuo Ward. The market is famous for its fresh seafood, fruits and vegetables, meats, dried fish, pickles, and confectionery. Many stalls will prepare, cook and serve their food to you right on the spot! An excellent place to stroll, sample, and snack on a delicious variety of fresh market foods. Then visit **Dotonbori**, one of Osaka's most popular tourist destinations, this street runs parallel to the Dotonbori canal. It is a popular shopping and entertainment district and is also known as a food destination. Next is a visit to the **Shinsaibashi Shopping Arcade** and the surrounding area is Osaka's premier shopping center. Approximately 600 meters long, this area is unique as it combines chain retail stores and trendy boutiques with department stores and top designer fashion labels. Finally stop at an **AEON MALL** for even more time for shopping, before departing for the Kansai International Airport for the return flight home. Depart Osaka via Japan Airlines flt #792 at 10:10 pm and in Honolulu at 10:25 am the same day. Aloha and welcome home! (B)
