Day 1: Wed, May 27 — HONOLULU. Depart Honolulu.

Day 2: Thur, May 28 - IN TRANSIT.

Day 3: Fri, May 29 - LONDON, UNITED KINGDOM. Arrive in London. Meet your Tour Director at the airport. Enjoy free time at **Hyde Park**. Hyde Park is the 350 acre park that was established by King Henry VIII in 1536, when he took the land from Westminster Abbey to use as a hunting ground. It quickly became popular when it was opened to the public in 1637. Ideal for your arrival day, this is a great opportunity to combine a traditional dining experience with a relaxed, night-time river cruise, viewing some of the capital's most beautiful illuminated sights. Enjoy a three-course dinner with several local menu choices. Following dinner, you will enjoy scenic views from the comfort of your private cruiser. Highlights include Tower Bridge, St. Paul's, and the Houses of Parliament, with commentary from your Guide as you cruise along the River Thames. PARK PLAZA WESTMINSTER BRIDGE or Similar (2 Nights) (D)

Day 4: Sat, May 30 — LONDON. Morning sightseeing with a Local Guide includes sights of the Houses of Parliament, Big Ben, Westminster Abbey, Whitehall's Mounted Horse Guards, Prime Minister's Downing Street Residence, Piccadilly Circus, Buckingham Palace, Trafalgar Square, and a visit to St. Paul's Cathedral. Visit Borough Market including time for lunch (at your own cost). In the afternoon, visit the **Tower of London**, one of the most famous historic buildings in the world. Built by William the Conqueror in 1066-1067, it has been quarded by Yeoman Warders (popularly known as the Beefeaters) since the 14th century. It has been a fortress, a royal palace, a prison, a place of execution, and an armory. It is most famously known as the home to the priceless Crown Jewels, including the solid gold crown used at Coronations, the Imperial State Crown, and Sovereigns Sceptre and the incredible Cullinan diamonds. Dinner at a local restaurant, (B, D)

Day 5: Sun, May 31 – LONDON (SOUTHAMPTON) – EMBARK MARINA. Morning at leisure. Transfer to pier and embark Marina. Depart 9:00 pm. (B, D)

Day 6: Mon, June 01 – AT SEA. (B, L, D)

Day 7: Tue, June 02 — EDINBURGH (SOUTH QUEENSFERRY), UNITED KINGDOM. Arrive 9:00 am. Depart 5:00 pm. Savor the old town's marvelous Georgian and Victorian architecture and impressive Edinburgh Castle, high on its volcanic crag with a fabulous view. Stroll along the medieval Royal Mile to the Palace of Holyroodhouse to see the abbey and Queen Mary's chambers. Visit St. Giles' Cathedral where John Knox once preached. (B, L, D)

Day 8: Wed, June 03 — SCRABSTER, UNITED KINGDOM. Arrive 8:00 am. Depart 5:00 pm. When sailing into Scrabster Harbour, you might feel like royalty, as for several decades Queen Elizabeth II disembarked here from the Royal Yacht Britannia to visit The Queen Mother at her summer holiday estate, the stunning 16th century Castle of Mey. Today, visitors are invited to tour the castle and grounds, which on a clear day offer sweeping views of the Orkney Islands. The 1826 Old Pulteney Distillery is the Scottish mainland's northernmost distillery, housed in a series of enchanting, stone-build



structures, and the thatched-roof Laidhay Caithness Croft takes you back in time to the lives of 18th century Scottish farmers and features a delightful tearoom. (B, L, D)

Day 9: Thur, June 04 – ULLAPOOL, UNITED KINGDOM. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 5:00 pm. Catch one of the ever-changing exhibitions of works by local artists at the Ullapool Visual Arts Centre and view impressive textiles, ceramics, paintings and photography. Trace your Scottish ancestry in the genealogy section of the Ullapool Museum housed in a repurposed Telford Parliamentary church or go hillwalking on one of the many slopes that rise from the sea up to the Scottish Highlands. (B, L, D)

Day 10: Fri, June 05 — LONDONDERRY, UNITED KINGDOM. Arrive 8:00 am. Depart 7:00 pm. One of the oldest continuously inhabited places in Ireland, Londonderry traces its roots to the 6^{th} century. Walls from the 17^{th} century still fortify the city center where you will find St. Columb's Cathedral, built in 1633. Take a stroll across the River Foyle on the newly constructed Peace Bridge, or enjoy gorgeous views of the Irish countryside on a visit to the Sperrin Mountains. The geological marvel known as the Giant's Causeway lies just east of the city. (B, L, D)

Day 11: Sat, June 06 – DOUGLAS, UNITED KINGDOM. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 5:00 pm. The capital of the Isle of Man, Douglas lies on a beautiful bay backed by wild moors and rugged glens. A horse-drawn tram ride is a great way to see the considerable sights. Don't miss the fascinating collection of Viking artifacts in the Manx Museum. (B, L, D)

Day 12: Sun, June 07 — BANGOR, UNITED KINGDOM. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 8:00 pm.

Day 13: Mon, June 08 – DUBLIN (DÚN LAOGHAIRE), IRELAND. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 8:00 pm. Considering it's the birthplace of some of the world's greatest literary figures — Beckett, Joyce, Shaw, Wilde, Yeats — you can't help but wonder what it is about Dublin that so inspires. Exploring the city, you find answers. It's the strong sense of community embodied in its pub culture, in the stunning churches seemingly on every corner, and in the sprawling parks where residents gather to commune with nature. It's also the history preserved in the ancient books of Trinity College's Old Library and in the story of Guinness and his iconic beer. Meanwhile, the charming seaside town of Dún Laoghaire possesses its own sense of timeless appeal, from the James Joyce Tower and Museum to the National Maritime Museum of Ireland. (B, L, D)

Day 14: Tue, June 09 – WATERFORD, IRELAND. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 7:00 pm. Stroll through this 1,100-year-old Viking town and admire Rodney's Tower, still in use, and see the exquisite treasures in the museum. Visit the Waterford Crystal Visitors' Centre, where you can see how the artisans cut their famous designs. Or enjoy the beautiful Irish

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countryside as you pass majestic abbey ruins, stroll through quaint villages and see remnants of Viking heritage. (B,L,D)

Day 15: Wed, June 10 – CORK (RINGASKIDDY), IRELAND. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 4:00 pm. Cheerful Cork sprawls about the River Lee in one of Ireland's most stunning settings. Bridges crisscross the city leading to landmarks like St. Anne's Church and the Old City Gaol, where you'll see the 19^{th} century prisoners' graffiti. Make time to kiss the Blarney Stone in Blarney Castle. (B, L, D)

Day 16: Thur, June 11 — PORTLAND, UNITED KINGDOM. Arrive 11:30 am. Depart 6:30 pm. Joined to the mainland of Dorset by narrow Chesil Beach, Portland is in the heart of England's dramatic Jurassic Coast, so called because its rock bed dates back 185 million years. The coastal cliffs and area's unique flora and fauna are awe-inspiring, the perfect complement to the town's rich history. Portland Castle overlooks the harbor and is one of Henry VIII's best-preserved coastal fortifications. Portland Bill Lighthouse is another landmark, literally, and has been guiding sailors for more than 300 years. You may also enjoy walking to the abandoned Tout Quarry, which has been turned into a delightful stone sculpture park. (B, L, D)

Day 17: Fri, June 12 — DISEMBARK MARINA — LONDON (SOUTHAMPTON), UNITED KINGDOM. Meet your Globus Tour Director as you disembark from the Oceania Marina. In the afternoon, visit **Windsor Castle**, the oldest and largest inhabited castle in the world. It has been the family home of British kings and queens for almost 1,000 years and is today one of the official residences of His Majesty The King. The Castle's State Apartments are furnished with some of the finest works from the Royal Collection, reflecting the changing tastes of the Castle's royal occupants, particularly those of Charles II and George IV. Among the masterpieces on display are paintings by Holbein, Rubens, and Van Dyck, Sèvres porcelain, and exquisite English and French furniture. Many of the works of art are still in the historic settings for which they were first collected or commissioned by the kings and queens who have lived at Windsor. Return to London for dinner at your hotel. PARK PLAZA WESTMINSTER BRIDGE or Similar (2 Nights) (B, D)

Day 18: Sat, June 13 – LONDON – EXCURSION TO STONEHENGE. Visit the most famous prehistoric monument in the world, **Stonehenge** stands alone in the vast empty tract of Salisbury plain. Next, head to Bath. Following our scenic drive into the heart of the city, there will be plenty of time to explore at your leisure. Also includes entrance to the **Roman Baths** that were built nearly 2,000 years ago. Special Farewell Dinner this evening at a local restaurant. (B, D)

Day 19: Sun, June 14 — LONDON — HONOLULU. Depart London. Return flight to Honolulu. Arrive Honolulu. Aloha and welcome home! (B)
