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Day 1: Sun, Mar 22 — HONOLULU. Depart Honolulu via Japan Airlines flt #791 at 11:25 am.

Day 2: Mon, Mar 23 — KANSAI. Arrive in Kansai International Airport at 3:55 pm. After entry formalities, walk to the hotel located across from the Kansai Airport. Dinner has been arranged at the hotel. HOTEL NIKKO KANSAI AIRPORT (1 Night) (D)

Day 3: Tue, Mar 24 — KANSAI — MIE — TOBA. After breakfast, depart Kansai for Toba. En route, stop in Mie and learn about ama, the local women who free dive for shellfish, sea vegetables and other marine products. Relax in the **Hachiman Kamado**, the huts used by the ama to warm up between dives. Enjoy some freshly caught seafood for lunch while the ama divers share stories of their adventures. After lunch, learn about pearls and pearl cultivation at **Mikimoto Pearl Island**. Enjoy special **Kaiseki Dinner** at the hotel tonight. Don't forget to try out the **onsen hot springs** — which are divided for men and women — allow you to enjoy the hot springs whether indoors or outdoors. The high-quality service and facilities are sure to become some of your fondest memories of your visit to Japan. TODAYA (2 Nights) (B, L, D)

Day 4: Wed, Mar 25 — TOBA — ISE — TOBA. After breakfast, travel to Ise and visit the **Ise Grand Shrine** (Ise Jingu Shrine), the most important Shinto shrine in the country. Dedicated to the sun goddess Amaterasu, Ise Grand Shrine is the ancestral shrine of the emperors of Japan. Next, explore **Okage Yokocho Street**, a street reproducing the crowded Ise temple town during the end stage of the Edo Period (1603–1868). There are many shops for you to explore and enjoy lunch (on your own) there. Next, visit **Toba Aquarium**, which contains one of the largest number of species of fish and animals in Japan spread out over twelve zones. The Toba Aquarium is also the only aquarium in Japan to have a dugong in captivity. Spend some time at **Toba Ichibangai**, the largest shopping center in Toba, before returning to the hotel for a buffet dinner. (B, D)

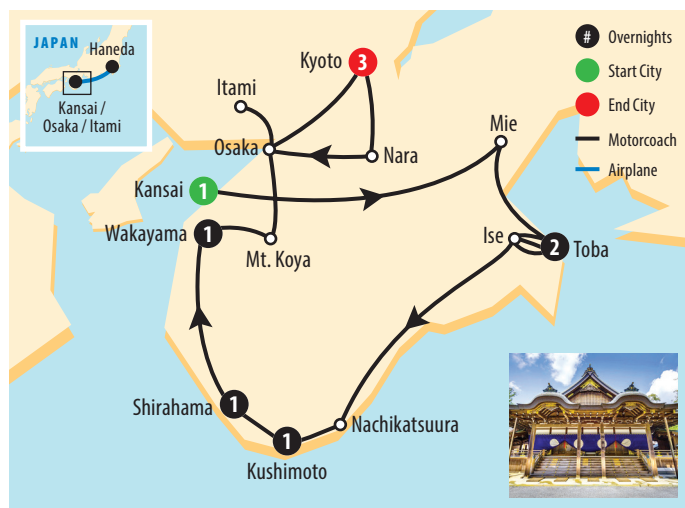
*Baggage will be sent from Toba to Wakayama, skipping Kushimoto and Shirahama. Prepare an overnight bag for two nights.

Day 5: Thur, Mar 26 — TOBA — NACHIKATSUURA — KUSHIMOTO. After breakfast, visit the **Futami Okitama Shrine**, where a number of shinto deities (kami) are enshrined. Many frog sculptures can be seen in the vicinity of the shrine as they are believed to be a type of charm for bringing people or things back. Not far from the shrine is the **Meoto Iwa**, a pair of large and small rocks located side by side in the sea. The larger of the two rocks represents the husband and the smaller one represents the wife. Both rocks are connected by a shimenawa rope which acts as the division between the spiritual and earthly realms. After lunch, visit **Kumano Nachi Taisha**, one of the three Kumano shrines, situated a few kilometers inland from the coastal hot spring resort of Katsuura. The shrine is part of a large complex of neighboring religious sites that exemplify the past fusion of Buddhist and Shinto. The site also boasts the tallest waterfall in Japan, **Nachi no Taki**. The tallest single-tiered waterfall in Japan, it was the original religious site in the area. Transfer to the hotel for a buffet dinner. MERCURE WAKAYAMA KUSHIMOTO RESORT & SPA (1 Night) (B, L, D)

Day 6: Fri, Mar 27 — KUSHIMOTO — SHIRAHAMA. After breakfast, visit the **Hashigui Iwa Rocks**, a group of 40 gigantic igneous rocks that form a line in the sea that is 850 meters long. Stop at **Toretore Market** for some shopping and lunch on your own. After lunch, visit the **Sandanbeki Cliffs** and **Sandanbeki Cave**. Lastly, visit **Senjoshiki**, a unique landscape located on the west coast of Shirahama before transferring to the hotel. NANKI-SHIRAHAMA MARRIOTT HOTEL (1 Night) (B, D)

Day 7: Sat, Mar 28 — SHIRAHAMA — WAKAYAMA. Depart Shirahama for Wakayama. Enjoy shopping at an **umeboshi (salted plum) factory**, for this uniquely Japanese staple. Next, learn about two ingredients essential to Japanese cuisine at the **Ota Kyusuke Miso Factory** and a **soy sauce factory**. For lunch, savor high-quality Japanese-style cuisine at Ganko Wakayama, an old Japanese estate with one of Japan's most renowned gardens. Lastly, visit **Wakayama Castle**. Built on the orders of warlord Toyotomi Hideyoshi in 1585. Unfortunately the castle did not survive WWII, and most of the present buildings are a 1958 post-war reconstruction. Only the Okaguchi Gate and stone walls remain from the original castle. Transfer to the hotel in Wakayama. Enjoy dinner at a local restaurant. HOTEL GRANVIA WAKAYAMA (1 Night) (B, L, D)

Day 8: Sun, Mar 29 — WAKAYAMA — MT. KOYA — OSAKA — KYOTO. After breakfast, explore **Mt. Koya** (Koya-san), the center of Shingon Buddhism; an important Buddhist sect which was introduced to Japan in 805 by Kobo Daishi (also known as Kukai), one of Japan's most significant religious figures. A small, secluded temple town has developed around the sect's headquarters that



Kobo Daishi built on Koyasan's wooded mountaintop. It is also the site of Kobo Daishi's mausoleum and the start and end point of the Shikoku 88 Temple Pilgrimage. Kobo Daishi began construction on the original Garan Temple Complex in 826 after wandering the country for years in search of a suitable place to center his religion. Since then over one hundred temples have sprung up along the streets of Koya-san. We visit the most important among them, Kongobuji, the head temple of Shingon Buddhism. Next explore **Dotonbori**, one of Osaka's most popular tourist destinations, this street runs parallel to the Dotonbori Canal. It is a popular shopping and entertainment district and is also known as a food destination. Enjoy lunch on your own while here. Lastly, visit to **Kuromon Ichiba Market**, a lively covered market which stretches for 580 meters in Osaka's Chuo Ward. The market is famous for its fresh seafood, fruits and vegetables, meats, dried fish, pickles, and confectionery. Many stalls will prepare, cook, and serve their food to you right on the spot! An excellent place to stroll, sample, and snack on a delicious variety of fresh market foods. Transfer to the hotel in Kyoto. The remainder of the day is at your leisure. The Local Guide will have suggestions on various dining and shopping opportunities nearby. DOUBLE TREE BY HILTON KYOTO STATION (3 Nights) (B)

Day 9: Mon, Mar 30 — KYOTO. After a delicious Japanese/Western buffet breakfast at the hotel, embark on a full day of sightseeing beginning with a visit to **Sanjusangen-do**, the popular name for Rengeo-in, a temple in eastern Kyoto which is famous for its 1,001 statues of Kannon, the goddess of mercy. Next, visit **Nijo Castle**. After the Tokugawa Shogunate fell in 1867, Nijo Castle was used as an imperial palace for a while before being donated to the city and opened up to the public as a historic site. Its palace buildings are arguably the best surviving examples of castle palace architecture of Japan's feudal era. Today's hands-on experience is **Surikomi Yuzen (brush dyed Yuzen)**, which is one of Kyoto's traditional craft "Kyo-Yuzen dyeing" techniques. Since the patterns are dyed by placing a paper stencil over a piece of fabric, such as a tote bag you can make an authentic piece, even if this is your first time. Your very own original work will be a perfect memento for yourself or a gift for someone. Lastly, we visit **Kinkakuji Temple (Golden Pavilion)**, a Zen temple whose top two floors are completely covered in gold leaf, before returning to the hotel. (B, L, D)

Day 10: Tue, Mar 31 — KYOTO. Full day at leisure. Your hotel is surrounded by department stores, specialty stores, and restaurants. A perfect day to fulfill your shopping list. Your Local Guide will be available to assist as needed. (B)

Day 11: Wed, Apr 01 — KYOTO — NARA — OSAKA — ITAMI — HANEDA — HONOLULU. After breakfast, check out from hotel. A full day of sightseeing is ahead. On our way back to Osaka, view the stunning vermilion colored **Fushimi Inari Shrine**, whose four kilometer long tunnel of scarlet torii gates was featured on the film *Memoirs of a Geisha*. After lunch, visit the **Todaiji Temple** in Nara. Todaiji, the largest wooden building in Japan, houses the largest bronze statue of Buddha at 16.3 meters high. The surrounding **Nara Deer Park** is inhabited by over 1,000 deer. A final shopping stop will be made at an **AEON MALL Rinku Sennan** before transferring to the Osaka Itami Airport for our return flight home. Depart Osaka via Japan Airlines flt #128 at 4:55 pm and arrive at the Haneda Domestic Airport at 6:15 pm. Depart Haneda International Airport via Japan Airlines flt #74 at 9:05 pm and arrive in Honolulu at 9:30 am the same day. Aloha and welcome home! (B, L)
