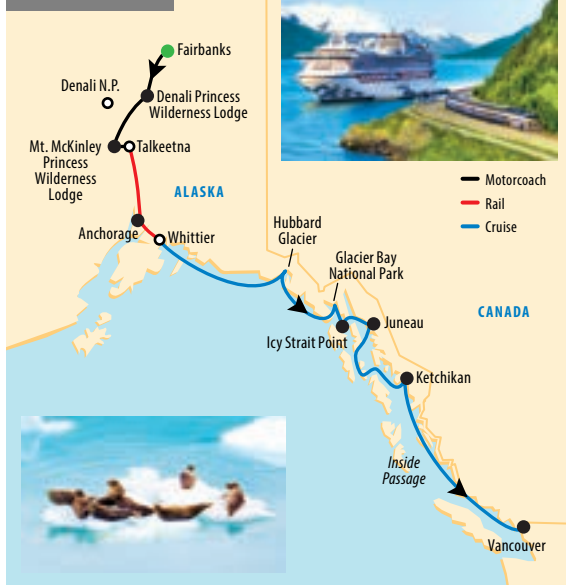

Day 1: Sat – HONOLULU. Depart Honolulu in the evening.

Day 2: Sun – FAIRBANKS. Arrive Fairbanks, Alaska. Alaska’s “Golden Heart City” of Fairbanks is a great introduction to the heart of this unique state. Check in to your hotel and get ready for the beginning of your adventure. The day is at your leisure. FAIRBANKS HOTEL (2 NIGHTS)

Day 3: Mon – FAIRBANKS. A full day in Fairbanks gives you time to get a feel for the unique culture and history of the region. You’ll take a **cruise on an authentic Sternwheeler Riverboat** down the Chena River then enjoy a **Gold Dredge #8 Mine Tour** with the chance to pan for your own gold. A hearty **miner’s lunch** is included. The evening is at leisure. (L)

Day 4: Tue – FAIRBANKS – DENALI. This morning, say goodbye to Fairbanks for the spectacular trip to Denali National Park via motorcoach. You’ll be welcomed at the Denali Princess Wilderness Lodge for a two-night retreat. Check in with the Guest Service Desk for help in planning your Denali adventure like a husky homestead tour, river rafting, hiking, glacier flightseeing, or an off-road ATV adventure. Or you may enjoy the spectacular main lodge, river view deck, and Princess Village with the popular Christmas cottage and sugar shack. Be sure to check out Fannie Q’s Saloon, named after a famed local homesteader, or sit outside at a fireplace patio. DENALI PRINCESS WILDERNESS LODGE (2 NIGHTS)

Day 5: Wed – DENALI. You have a full day to get out into one of America’s best national parks. This afternoon, explore Denali National Park on a **Nature History Tour**, watching for glimpses of Denali as well as Denali’s “big five” – bears, moose, caribou, wolves, and dall sheep.

Day 6: Thur – DENALI – MT. MCKINLEY. This morning, you’ll travel by motorcoach to Denali State Park for two relaxing nights at the Mt. McKinley Princess Wilderness Lodge. Take in the sensational views of Denali and the Alaska Range with a glass of wine in the Great Room or on the expansive deck. Hear stories about climbing Denali in the Hudson Theater or roast a marshmallow at the fireside patio. MT. MCKINLEY PRINCESS WILDERNESS LODGE (2 NIGHTS)

Day 7: Fri – MT. MCKINLEY. You have a full day to plan however you choose. Stop by the Tour Desk to book a variety of optional excursions. Walk the nature trails around the lodge or sit and gaze at the majesty of “The Great One” from the lodge’s treehouse designed and built by Pete Nelson of Animal Planet’s *Treehouse Masters*.

Day 8: Sat – MT. MCKINLEY – TALKEETNA – RAIL TO WHITTIER – EMBARK DISCOVERY PRINCESS. After a morning enjoying the lodge, you’ll transfer

to the historic town of Talkeetna to board our exclusive **Direct-to-the-Wilderness Rail Service** for the journey to Whittier and your waiting ship. Embark the Discovery Princess. Set sail this evening. Enjoy the Sail Away Party. Depart 8:30 pm. (D)

Day 9: Sun – HUBBARD GLACIER (SCENIC CRUISING). 3:00 pm – 8:00 pm. Nicknamed the “Galloping Glacier,” this east Alaskan glacier is rapidly advancing toward the Gulf of Alaska into a pristine area known as Disenchantment Bay. In fact, its movement temporarily formed a natural dam that twice closed off nearby Russell Fjord from the bay, but the intense water pressure building within the fjord-turned-lake has thus far been enough to explode through the wall of ice. The **largest tidewater glacier in North America**, Hubbard Glacier measures **76 miles long** and plunges **1,200 feet into the depths of the bay**. Its immense beauty and phenomenal blue hues are enchanting, even from afar. But it’s when your cruise ship draws closer that its towering surface really impresses, dwarfing even the uppermost deck on your ship at a **whopping 40 stories high**. There, with the snowcapped mountains serving as a glorious backdrop, you’ll have a **prime viewing spot from which to witness the glacier calving**, as it often expels icebergs the size of 10-story buildings—imagine the splash! The area around Hubbard Glacier is also **renowned for its wildlife**, where whales, harbor seals and otters swim, brown bears, moose and black-tailed deer roam ashore, and a wide variety of seabirds soar gracefully across the sky. Day 10: Mon – GLACIER BAY NATIONAL PARK (SCENIC CRUISING). 9:15 am – 6:15 pm. Princess is one of a select few cruise lines permitted to cruise the pristine waters of Glacier Bay, the highlight of this seven-day “Voyage of the Glaciers” cruise. Just west of Juneau, this **breathhtaking national park and preserve** boasts some of the **world’s most spectacular tidewater glaciers**, such as Margerie Glacier, which often drops colossal chunks of ice into the sea. Not surprisingly, Glacier Bay National Park and its epic ice giants are part of a UNESCO World Heritage Site comprising Alaska’s magnificent park system. During your scenic cruise, friendly **Park Rangers will join the ship to share their knowledge** of this amazing place and host a fun Junior Ranger program for kids. They may even be able to **help you identify Glacier Bay’s abundant wildlife**, including humpback whales, sea otters, porpoises, harbor seals, black bears, mountain goats, bald eagles and large colonies of seabirds. Take in the awe-inspiring scenery as you enjoy an unforgettable day of sailing through this dazzling park, where you’ll glide along emerald waters and past calving icebergs, and can breathe in the crisp, fresh air to your heart’s content. (B, L, D)

Day 11: Tue – ICY STRAIT POINT. 6:00 am – 7:00 pm. Nearby Alaska’s largest Tlingit village exists a uniquely Alaskan place – Icy Strait Point. Hoonah, meaning “**village by the cliff**,” is home to the **Huna Tlingit** who have occupied this area for thousands of years. Local legend tells how they were **forced from their ancestral home in Glacier Bay by advancing glaciers**, resulting in their relocation to and settlement of Hoonah. In 1912,

the Hoonah Packing Co. built a large cannery one mile north of town. After only five years of operation, the cannery at Icy Strait Point turned out 152,505 cases of one-pound cans of salmon, the largest pack ever achieved in Alaska. Today, Hoonah is **home to nearly 750 residents**. Visitors will be intrigued by its rich Native heritage, opportunities to see wildlife and the vast wilderness that surrounds this unique village. **Icy Strait’s waters have yielded record-breaking halibut and salmon catches** and provide summer-long access to all five species of salmon. Chichagof Island, on which Icy Strait Point is located, supports one of the largest concentrations of brown bears in the world and sightings are common. (B, L, D)

Day 12: Wed – JUNEAU. 6:30 am – 4:00 pm. In 1880, it was slow going for Joe Juneau and Richard Harris as they searched for gold with the help of Native Guides. After climbing mountains, forging streams and facing countless difficulties, they found nuggets “as large as beans.” From their discovery came **three of the largest gold mines in the world**. By the end of World War II, more than \$150 million in gold had been mined. Eventually the mines closed, but the town Joe Juneau founded became the **capital of Alaska** and the business of gold was replaced by the business of government. Some 30,000 people live in Juneau. Its total area makes it one of the biggest towns, in size, in the world. Only Kiruna, Sweden, and Sitka, Alaska, exceed Juneau’s 3,248 square miles. Today Juneau is famous not only for gold and government but also for its breathtakingly beautiful glaciers and stunning views of both water and mountains. (B, L, D)

Day 13: Thur – KETCHIKAN. 10:00 am – 5:00 pm. Ketchikan is known as **Alaska’s “First City”** because it’s the first major community travelers come to as they journey north. Located on an island, Ketchikan **began life as an Indian fishing camp**. The name Ketchikan comes from a **Tlingit phrase that means “eagle with spread-out wings,”** a reference to a waterfall near town. In the early 1900s, when gold was Alaska’s claim to fame, fishing and timber industries were established in Ketchikan. The growth of these industries helped make this Inside Passage port Alaska’s fourth-largest city. Visitors to Ketchikan will be intrigued by its rich Native heritage, which includes the **world’s oldest collection of totem poles** at Totem Heritage Center. The Haida, Tlingit, and Tsimshian are all a part of the city’s colorful history. Ketchikan, with its **abundance of salmon**, is also a sportfishing paradise. Sightseers will be impressed with both the scenic town and its surroundings, especially Misty Fjords National Monument. (B, L, D)

Day 14: Fri – AT SEA. (B, L, D)

Day 15: Sat – VANCOUVER (BRITISH COLUMBIA), CANADA – DISEMBARK DISCOVERY PRINCESS – SEATTLE, UNITED STATES – HONOLULU. Disembark the Discovery Princess. Enjoy a scenic drive from Vancouver to Seattle. Depart Seattle. Arrive Honolulu. Aloha and welcome home! (B)
