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Day 1: Tue, Nov 10 – HONOLULU. Depart Honolulu via Japan Airlines flt #73 at 12:05 pm.

Day 2: Wed, Nov 11 – HANEDA – TOKYO. Arrive at the Haneda International Airport at 4:05 pm. After entry formalities, transfer by coach to your hotel in Tokyo. Enjoy a buffet dinner at the hotel. KEIO PLAZA HOTEL TOKYO (3 Nights) (D)

Day 3: Thur, Nov 12 – TOKYO. After a sumptuous buffet breakfast, embark on a full day of discovery! First visit **Meiji Shrine**, a Shinto shrine dedicated to the deified spirits of the Emperor Meiji and his wife, Empress Shoken. Then, visit the visually stimulating **Harajuku shopping district**. Today's highlight will be a hands-on **sushi making session**, which will yield your delicious lunch. After lunch, head to **Asakusa**, the center of Tokyo's shitamachi (literally "low city"), one of Tokyo's districts, where an atmosphere of the Tokyo of past decades survives. Asakusa's main attraction is **Sensoji**, a very popular Buddhist temple built in the 7th century. The temple is approached via the **Nakamise**, a shopping street that has been providing temple visitors with a variety of traditional local snacks and tourist souvenirs for centuries. Next is **Ameyoko**, a busy market street between Okachimachi and Ueno Stations. The name "Ameyoko" is a short form for "Ameya Yokochō" ("candy store alley"), as candies were traditionally sold there. Alternatively, "Ame" also stands for "America", because a lot of American products used to be available there when the street was the site of a black market in the years following WWII. Today, various products such as clothes, bags, cosmetics, fresh fish, dried food, and spices are sold along Ameyoko. Return to the hotel for an evening of leisure. The area around the hotel is filled with various dining and shopping opportunities. (B, L)

Day 4: Fri, Nov 13 – TOKYO. Day at leisure. Enjoy shopping and dining in the bustling Shinjuku area. Your Local Guide will be available to assist as needed. Perfect day to relax and/or visit with family and friends in Tokyo. (B)

*Baggage will be sent from Tokyo to Kyoto, skipping Hakone. Prepare an overnight bag for one night.

Day 5: Sat, Nov 14 – TOKYO – OSHINO – HAKONE. After breakfast, depart Tokyo for Hakone. Visit **Oshino Hakkai**, a set of eight ponds located in the Fuji Five Lake region. The eight ponds are fed by melting snow from the nearby slopes of Mt. Fuji. The melted snow filtered down through porous layers of lava for 80 years creates a very clear spring water that is revered by the locals. Visitors can drink the cool water straight from the source. Continue to Hakone, where much of the area is considered an active volcanic zone since its creation from eruption of Mt. Hakone some 3,000 years ago. After lunch, enjoy a **boat ride on the beautiful Lake Ashi**. Then, transfer to the hotel for a buffet dinner. Be sure to have a relaxing soak in the **onsen hot springs**, which are divided for men and women, indoors or outdoors. The high-quality service and facilities are sure to become some of your fondest memories of your visit to Japan. HAKONE KOWAKIEN HOTEL (1 Night) (B, L, D)

Day 6: Sun, Nov 15 – HAKONE – KYOTO. Before departing Hakone, visit **Owakudani** ("Great Boiling Valley"), the source of the hot spring waters of Hakone. Then take in the view of the surrounding countryside from the **Hakone Ropeway**. Transfer to Odawara Train Station where we will board a **Shinkansen Bullet Train** to Kyoto Station. Transfer to the hotel on foot. After check-in, explore the many restaurants and shops conveniently located near your hotel. Remainder of the day is at your leisure. The Local Guide will have suggestions for dinner. MIYAKO HOTEL KYOTO HACHIJYO (2 Nights) (B)

Day 7: Mon, Nov 16 – KYOTO. Begin the day exploring the wonders of **teamLab BioVortex**, a new concept by the team behind the international art collective teamLab. This venue focuses on a high-dimensional thinking athletics space based on the concept of perceiving the world with your body and thinking about it high-dimensionally. In a complex and challenging space, you will be immersed in a physically challenging four-dimensional world where time changes with the presence of your body. After lunch, visit **Kinkakuji Temple (Golden Pavilion)**, a Zen Temple whose top two floors are completely covered in gold leaf. When the Tokugawa Shogunate fell



in 1867, **Nijo Castle** was used as an imperial palace for a while before being donated to the city and opened up to the public as a historic site. Its palace buildings are arguably the best surviving examples of castle palace architecture of Japan's feudal era. Finally, today's hands-on experience is **yuzen dyeing** (surikomi yuzen), which is one of Kyoto's traditional craft dyeing techniques. Since the patterns are dyed by placing a paper stencil over a piece of fabric, such as a tote bag, you can make an authentic piece, even if this is your first time. A great souvenir of this tour! Return to the hotel for a buffet dinner. (B, L, D)

Day 8: Tue, Nov 17 – KYOTO – UJI – KANSAI – HONOLULU. After breakfast, check out from hotel. A full day of sightseeing is ahead. Begin the day at the Tea and Uji Community Center, **Chazuna**, where you will **learn how to grind green tea** leaves via a grinding millstone. You can brew your own ground matcha in a teapot and drink it. Next, visit **Byodo-in Temple**. Together with its garden, the temple represents the "Pure Land Paradise" and was influential on later temple construction. Byodo-in was initially built in 998 as a countryside retreat villa for the powerful politician Fujiwara no Michinaga, not as a temple. After lunch at a local restaurant, explore **Byodo-in Omotesando**, the road leading up to the main gate of Byodo-in Temple, where long-established tea shops are located. The air is filled with the fragrance of tea. In 2001, the Ministry of the Environment recognized it as one of the "Top 100 Fragrant Landscapes to Pass on and Preserve." In addition to the long-established Uji tea shops, there are plenty of stores selling unique local products of Uji and souvenir shops. There are also numerous restaurants and cafés where you can leisurely enjoy a menu full of tea-based dishes, such as tea dumplings, matcha sweets, tea soba noodles, as well as Kyoto-style obanzai (traditional home-cooked dishes). One of the major attractions is the ability to enjoy authentic matcha soft serve ice cream while walking around. Try comparing the matcha soft serve from different shops and find your favorite. A final shopping stop will be made at **AEON MALL Rinku Sennan** before transferring to Kansai International Airport for our return flight home. Depart Kansai via Japan Airlines flt #790 at 10:10 pm and arrive in Honolulu at 10:25 am the same day. Aloha and welcome home! (B, L)
