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**Day 1: Sun, Nov 08** — HONOLULU. Depart Honolulu via Japan Airlines flt #799 at 11:25 am.

**Day 2: Mon, Nov 09** — KANSAI. Arrive in the Kansai International Airport at 3:55 pm. After entry formalities, walk to the hotel located within the airport. Enjoy dinner at the hotel. HOTEL NIKKO KANSAI AIRPORT (1 Night) (D)

**Day 3: Tue, Nov 10** — KANSAI — TOKUSHIMA — NARUTO. After a sumptuous buffet breakfast at the hotel, embark on a full day of sightseeing. Start with a visit to the **Tokushima Prefectural Awa Jurobe Yashiki (Puppet Theater and Museum)** to learn about awa ningyo joruri, a traditional performance art of Tokushima using puppets made of cypress wood. The lifelike movement of the dolls combined with traditional music is a unique entertainment experience and is designated as a national important intangible folk-culture asset. After lunch, explore the **Awa Odori Kaikan (Awa Dance Museum)** before taking a **Naruto Whirlpool Cruise**. The whirlpools, which occur along the Shikoku Coast of the Naruto Strait, are created by the large volumes of water moving between the Seto Inland Sea and the Pacific Ocean between high and low tide, combined with the unique underwater geography of the narrow strait. Arrive at the hotel for a buffet dinner. AOAWO NARUTO RESORT (1 Night) (B, L, D)

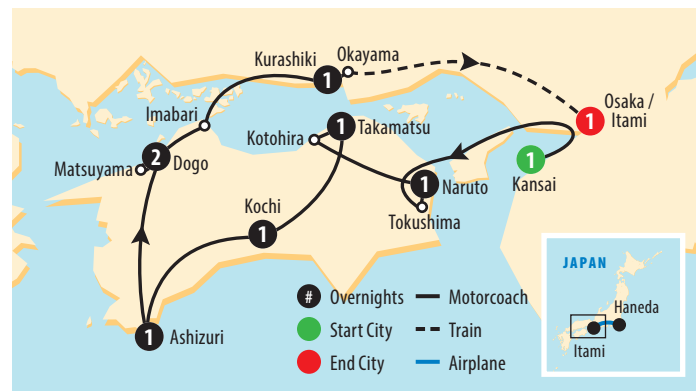
**Day 4: Wed, Nov 11** — NARUTO — KOTOHIRA — TAKAMATSU. Begin the day learning how to **dye using Indigo**, a technique that is very well known in Tokushima. To ensure that the cloth had been dyed thoroughly it is soaked in a tray for about two minutes before it is thoroughly rinsed with water. Take home your dyed handkerchief as a souvenir of your trip. Next, we learn how to **make udon noodles** and enjoy your hand-made creation for lunch. After lunch, visit the **Kotohira Shrine**. Next, take a stroll around **Ritsurin Garden**, a landscape garden in Takamatsu City, built by the local feudal lords during the early Edo Period. Considered one of the best gardens in Japan, it is often suggested that Ritsurin Garden deserves a spot on the list of the “three most beautiful gardens of Japan” alongside Kanazawa’s Kenrokuen, Mito’s Kairakuen, and Okayama’s Korakuen. Arrive at the hotel for an evening of leisure. JR HOTEL CLEMENT TAKAMATSU (1 Night) (B, L)

\*Baggage will be sent from Takamatsu to Dogo, skipping Kochi and Ashizuri. Prepare overnight bag for two nights.

**Day 5: Thur, Nov 12** — TAKAMATSU — KOCHI. Start the day with a **boat cruise in Oboke Gorge**. On this gentle 30 minute boat ride down the Yoshino River, guides point out interesting rocks, many of which resemble different animals, along the way. Next, visit to the **Kazurabashi Bridge**, a suspension bridge made of mountain vines, was built as a way to move people and goods across the river and as a deterrent to outsiders, which could easily be cut down if enemies approached. After lunch, learn how to **make washi paper**. A great souvenir of your trip! Then tour the **Kochi Yosakoi Joho Koryukan**, a museum that highlights the history and appeal of the summer festival that began in 1954. Enjoy a buffet dinner at the hotel tonight. OMO7 KOCHI BY HOSSHINO RESORTS (1 Night) (B, L, D)

**Day 6: Fri, Nov 13** — KOCHI — ASHIZURI. After breakfast, visit **Kochi Castle**, one of just twelve Japanese castles to have survived the fires, wars and other catastrophes of the post feudal age. Learn how to **make seared bonito**. Enjoy your creation for lunch. After, stop at **Katsurahama**, where you will find a statue of the famous historical hero Sakamoto Ryoma (1835–1867). He played an important role in opening up modern Japan at the end of the Edo period. Then, take a **cruise on the Shimanto River**. Finally, head to your hotel to enjoy a relaxing soak in the **onsen hot springs** and delicious **Kaiseki Dinner**. ASHIZURI KOKUSAI HOTEL (1 Night) (B, L, D)

**Day 7: Sat, Nov 14** — ASHIZURI — DOGO. Visit the **John Mung Museum** and learn how he was instrumental in the opening of Japan to foreigners. After lunch, **pick mikan (mandarin oranges)** at a local farm before transferring to Dogo and relax your body at the world-famous **Dogo onsens**, one of the oldest onsens in Japan, with a history stretching back over 1,000 years. The area around Dogo retains the feeling of a resort town, with guests from all over the country wandering the streets in yukata robes after their bath. Don’t forget to check out the nearby shopping arcade full of shops selling local products of the area. If you time your visit right, you can watch the Botchan Karakuri Clock, located at the entrance of the shopping arcade, come to life like a cuckoo clock (every



hour between 8:00 am and 10:00 pm). There is also a free foot bath at the base of the clock. Savor a seasonal, traditional, multi-course **Kaiseki Dinner** at the hotel. DOGOKAN (2 Nights) (B, L, D)

**Day 8: Sun, Nov 15** — DOGO — MATSUYAMA — DOGO. Take the **Matsuyama Ropeway**, a single-chair chairlift, a pleasant and popular way to ascend Mt. Katsuyama and visit the **Matsuyama Castle**. **Ishiteji Temple**, located near Dogo to the northeast of Matsuyama’s city center, is the city’s most famous temple. It is number 51 of the 88 temples on the Shikoku Pilgrimage. Pilgrims dressed in white are a frequent sight at this large temple. After lunch, take a **guided stroll of the Dogo onsen area**. This evening enjoy a different seasonal, traditional, multi-course **Kaiseki Dinner** at the hotel. (B, L, D)

\*Baggage will be sent from Dogo to Osaka, skipping Kurashiki. Prepare overnight bag for one night.

**Day 9: Mon, Nov 16** — DOGO — IMABARI — KURASHIKI. Begin the day with a stop at the **Imabari Towel Museum**. Located in Imabari, Japan’s largest towel producing town, this unique museum is dedicated to showing off the wonders of the towel. Later, stop at a road side **Michi-no-Eki** stand for lunch (on your own). Not only do they provide a clean and convenient rest stop, local farmers and fisherman sell their products at rock-bottom prices. After lunch, travel across the **Shimanami Kaido**, the 60km long toll road that connects Japan’s main island of Honshu to the island of Shikoku. **Take a tour of a sake brewery and taste some of their products**. Then, continue to the hotel in Kurashiki. Enjoy a Western dinner at the hotel. KURASHIKI IVY SQUARE (1 Night) (B, D)

**Day 10: Tue, Nov 17** — KURASHIKI — OKAYAMA — OSAKA. After breakfast, visit explore the **Kurashiki Bikan Area** and enjoy lunch here (on your own). After lunch, stop at **Korakuen Garden**, considered one of the “three most beautiful gardens of Japan.” Next, transfer by **Shinkansen Bullet Train** to Shin-Osaka Station. The remainder of the day is free to explore department stores, specialty shops and an expansive underground shopping oasis. HOTEL GRANVIA OSAKA (1 Night) (B)

**Day 11: Wed, Nov 18** — OSAKA — ITAMI — HANEDA — HONOLULU. After hotel checkout, start the day with a visit to **Abeno Harukas**, at 300 meters tall it was the largest skyscraper in Japan from the time of its completion in 2014 until 2023. The **observation deck, called Harukas 300**, occupies the building’s top three floors. With large floor-to-ceiling glass panels, the 60<sup>th</sup> floor offers 360 degree views of Osaka, while the 58<sup>th</sup> floor offers an inner court with a wooden deck and café. Next, visit Dotonbori and Shinsaibashi Shopping Arcade, a couple of Osaka’s most popular tourist destinations. **Dotonbori** is a popular shopping and entertainment district that runs parallel to the Dotonbori Canal, and is also known as a food destination. At approximately 600m long, **Shinsaibashi Shopping Arcade** and the surrounding area is Osaka’s premier shopping center. The unique area combines chain retail stores and trendy boutiques with department stores and top designer fashion labels. Enjoy lunch here (on your own). A final shopping stop will be made at an **AEON MALL** before transferring to the Osaka Itami Airport for our return flight home. Depart Osaka via Japan Airlines flt #128 at 4:45 pm and arrive in the Haneda Domestic Airport at 6:00 pm. Depart Haneda International Airport via Japan Airlines flt #74 at 9:00 pm and arrive Honolulu at 9:00 am the same day. Aloha and welcome home! (B)
