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Day 1: Sun, Nov 15 – HONOLULU. Depart Honolulu via Japan Airlines flt #799 at 11:25 am.

Day 2: Mon, Nov 16 – KANSAI. Arrive at Kansai International Airport at 3:55 pm. After entry formalities, walk to the hotel located within the airport. Dinner will be served at the hotel. HOTEL NIKKO KANSAI AIRPORT (1 Night) (D)

Day 3: Tue, Nov 17 – KANSAI – KYOTO. After a sumptuous buffet breakfast at the hotel, embark on a full day of sightseeing beginning with a visit to **Kinkakuji (Temple of the Golden Pavilion)**, a Zen Temple whose top two floors are completely covered in gold leaf. After lunch, explore the grounds of **Nijo Castle**. When the Tokugawa Shogunate fell in 1867, Nijo Castle was used as an imperial palace for a while before being donated to the city and opened up to the public as a historic site. Its palace buildings are arguably the best surviving examples of castle palace architecture of Japan's feudal era. Finally, today's hands-on experience is **yuzen dyeing**, which is one of Kyoto's traditional craft dyeing techniques. Since the patterns are dyed by placing a paper stencil over a piece of fabric, such as a tote bag, you can make an authentic piece, even if this is your first time. A great souvenir of this tour! Transfer to the hotel for an evening of leisure. After check-in, explore the many restaurants and shops conveniently located near your hotel. DOUBLETREE BY HILTON KYOTO STATION (3 Nights) (B, L)

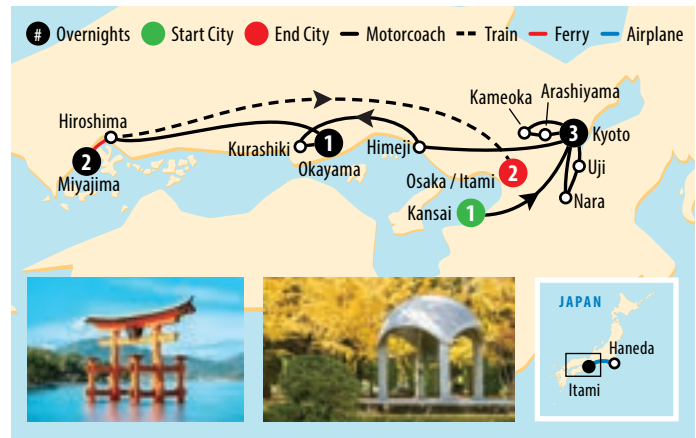
Day 4: Wed, Nov 18 – KYOTO – KAMEOKA – ARASHIYAMA – KYOTO. After breakfast, travel to Kameoka and board the **Sagano Torokko Ressha (Sagano Romantic Train)** to Arashiyama. In Arashiyama, you'll have the choice of several activities. Explore the famous **Arashiyama Bamboo Forests**. Or shop for world-famous Arashiyama bamboo products. Enjoy a very special **yudofu (boiled tofu)** set menu lunch, a local Arashiyama specialty. **Learn how to make wagashi (traditional Japanese sweets)**. Return to Kyoto for another evening of leisure. (B, L)

Day 5: Thur, Nov 19 – KYOTO – UJI – NARA – KYOTO. Begin the day at the Tea and Uji Community Center, **Chazuna**, where you will **learn how to grind matcha (green tea) leaves** via a grinding millstone. You can brew your own ground matcha in a teapot and drink it. Next, visit **Byodoin Temple**. Together with its garden, the temple represents the "Pure Land Paradise" and was influential on later temple construction. Byodoin was initially built in 998 as a countryside retreat villa for the powerful politician Fujiwara no Michinaga, not as a temple. Did you know that 95% of Japan's ink is currently produced in Nara? After lunch, you'll **learn about the art of nigiri sumi (ink sticks)**, which has been around since the Muromachi period (1336–1573) at **Nara Sumi Kinkoen**. An artisan will tell you about the history of this craft as he demonstrates how to mold the raw ink, with the warmth of your hands, into a one-of-a-kind hand-pressed nigiri sumi that will bear the impression of your hand and fingerprints. Next, using nigiri sumi that have already dried and hardened, you'll **practice the art of calligraphy** as you learn to write your name in hiragana. What fun! Before departing Nara, visit **Todaiji Temple**, the largest wooden building in Japan that houses the largest bronze statue of Buddha, measuring 16.3m high. The surrounding **Nara Deer Park** is inhabited by over 1,000 deer. Will these deer "bow" to you for a cracker (sold on Nara Park grounds)? Return to the hotel in Kyoto for a Western dinner. (B, L, D)

Day 6: Fri, Nov 20 – KYOTO – HIMEJI – KURASHIKI – OKAYAMA. After a sumptuous buffet breakfast we drive to Himeji to visit **Himeji Castle**. It is known as "White Egret Castle" and "White Heron Castle" because of its brilliant white exterior, resembling a bird taking flight. Himeji Castle is the largest and most visited castle in Japan. This splendid example of traditional architecture was declared one of the first UNESCO World Heritage Sites in Japan. After lunch, visit **Kurashiki** and the **Bikan Area**. In merchant days, this scenic town thrived as a port for rice shipments. Several old rice granaries and examples of historic architecture still remain, in addition to the stone lined canal. Transfer to Okayama where you will enjoy shopping and dining (on your own) at an **AEON MALL**. HOTEL GRANVIA OKAYAMA (1 Night) (B, L)

*Baggage will be sent from Okayama to Osaka, skipping Miyajima. Prepare an overnight bag for two nights.

Day 7: Sat, Nov 21 – OKAYAMA – HIROSHIMA – MIYAJIMA. Depart Okayama for Hiroshima. After lunch, visit the **Peace Memorial Park, Hiroshima Peace Memorial Museum, Atomic Bomb Dome, Children's Memorial**, and the **Peace Bell**. After a **short ferry ride** arrive on the island of Miyajima, considered sacred by many. This evening soak in the relaxing atmosphere of Iwasa Inn's **onsen hot spring baths**. You can enjoy the beauty of the primeval forests and gentle sound of mountain streams while taking a bath. This evening enjoy a traditional, multi-course **Kaiseki Dinner** featuring Hiroshima's local and seasonal ingredients including fresh seafood from the Seto Inland Sea. IWASO INN (2 Nights) (B, L, D)



Day 8: Sun, Nov 22 – MIYAJIMA. After a special breakfast, walk to the nearby **Itsukushima Shrine**. At high tide, the vermilion torii gate looks like it's floating in the middle of the sea. The shrine complex has been selected as one of Japan's nihon sankei (three most scenic places). **Learn how to make momiji manju**, a specialty of the area. After, explore **Omotesando Street**, the main street of Miyajima Island, for excellent shopping and numerous choices for lunch (on your own). Then, take in the view from the **Miyajima Ropeway**, the cable car and gondola system linking Miyajima township to Mt. Misen. On a clear day, the ropeway provides an excellent observation point. The remainder of the afternoon is at your leisure. This evening enjoy a different variety of **Kaiseki Dinner**. Be sure to enjoy the **onsens** before and after your dinner. (B, D)

Day 9: Mon, Nov 23 – MIYAJIMA – HIROSHIMA – OSAKA. After breakfast, we make our way back to Hiroshima via a **short ferry ride**. We then take a ride on the **JR Super Express Train** to Osaka. After checking-in to the hotel, the remainder of the day is at your leisure. Your Local Guide will have many suggestions for dinner and shopping. HOTEL GRANVIA OSAKA (2 Nights) (B)

Day 10: Tue, Nov 24 – OSAKA. Full day at leisure. A perfect day to fulfill the remainder of your omiyage shopping list. Your Local Guide will be available to assist as needed. (B)

Day 11: Wed, Nov 25 – OSAKA – ITAMI – HANEDA – HONOLULU. After hotel checkout, start the day with a visit to **Kuromon Ichiba Market**, a lively covered market which stretches for 580m in Osaka's Chuo Ward. The market is famous for its fresh seafood, fruits and vegetables, meats, dried fish, pickles, and confectionery. Many stalls will prepare, cook and serve their food to you right on the spot! An excellent place to stroll, sample, and snack on a delicious variety of fresh market foods. Next, visit Dotonbori and Shinsaibashi Shopping Arcade, a couple of Osaka's most popular tourist destinations. **Dotonbori** is a popular shopping and entertainment district that runs parallel to Dotonbori Canal, and is also known as a food destination. At approximately 600m long, **Shinsaibashi Shopping Arcade** and the surrounding area is Osaka's premier shopping center. The unique area combines chain retail stores and trendy boutiques with department stores and top designer fashion labels. Enjoy lunch here (on your own). Transfer to the Osaka Itami Airport for your return flight home. Depart Itami via Japan Airlines flt #128 at 4:45 pm and arrive in the Haneda Domestic Airport at 6:00 pm. Depart Haneda International Airport via Japan Airlines flt #74 at 9:00 pm and arrive Honolulu at 9:00 am the same day. Aloha and welcome home! (B)
