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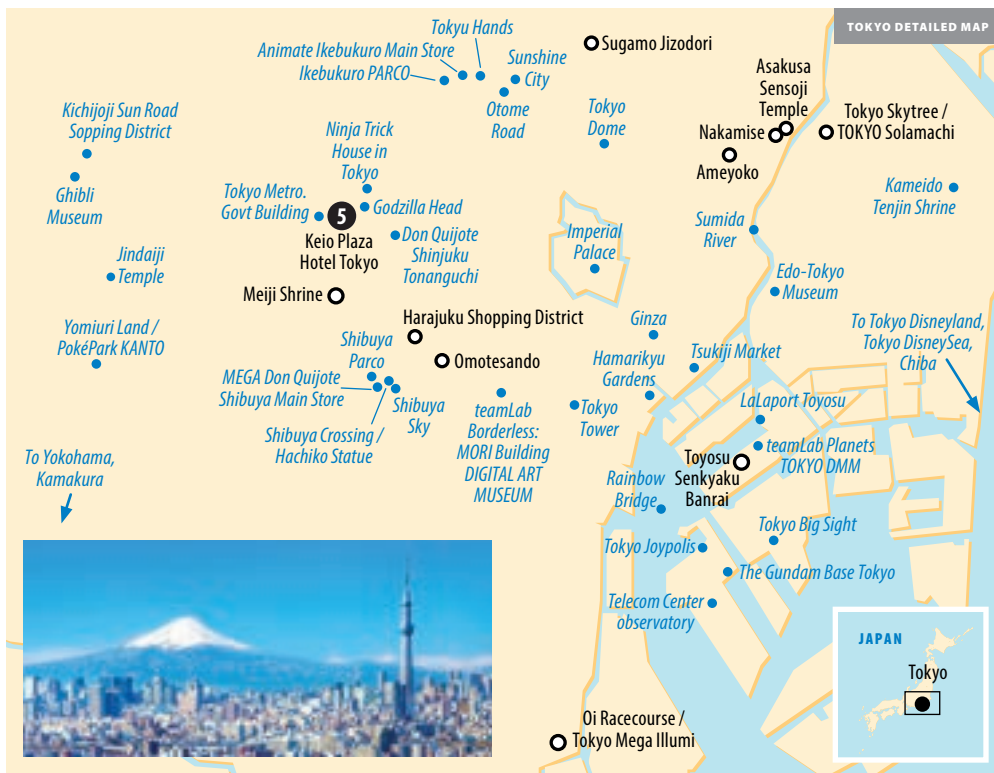
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KEIO PLAZA HOTEL TOKYO – 4-STARS (5 NIGHTS):

“Luxury in the heart of Tokyo.” The hotel is at the perfect location to explore the delights of the city of Tokyo. The hotel is just outside of Tocho Mae Station and only a five-minute walk from Shinjuku Station, and some of the most popular shopping and entertainment spots nearby.



Day 1: Fri, Dec 04 – HONOLULU. Depart Honolulu via Japan Airlines flt #73 at 11:40 am.

Day 2: Sat, Dec 05 – HANEDA – TOKYO. Arrive in the Haneda International Airport at 4:05 pm. After entry formalities, transfer by coach to your hotel in Tokyo and enjoy an evening of leisure. The Local Guide will have suggestions for dinner nearby. KEIO PLAZA HOTEL TOKYO (5 Nights)

Day 3: Sun, Dec 06 – TOKYO. After a sumptuous buffet breakfast, embark on a full day of discovery! Begin the day exploring **Asakusa**, the center of Tokyo’s shitamachi (literally “low city”) districts, where an atmosphere of the Tokyo of past decades survives. Asakusa’s main attraction is **Sensoji**, a very popular Buddhist temple built in the 7th century. The temple is approached via the **Nakamise**, a shopping street that has been providing temple visitors with a variety of traditional local snacks and souvenirs for centuries. Today’s highlight will be a hands-on **sushi making class**, which will yield your delicious lunch. After lunch, take in the view of the surrounding city from the observation deck of the **Tokyo Skytree**. At just over 2,000 ft tall, it is the tallest tower in Tokyo. Rising 350m above the ground, the Tokyo Skytree Tembo Deck offers a 360-degree panoramic view of Tokyo. **TOKYO Solamachi**, located at the base of the Tokyo Skytree, is one of the biggest shopping, dining and entertainment complexes in Tokyo. Containing over 130 fashion and accessory shops and boutiques, nearly 100 stores selling food and sweets, over 75 cafés and restaurants, along with many shops offering a variety of Japanese traditional and pop-culture goods. Lastly, visit **Oi Racecourse** for the **TOKYO MEGA ILLUMI**. It’s the biggest illumination event in Tokyo and themed around “the past, present, and future.” Get your photo taken with an adorable miniature pony, travel back in time and enjoy light displays modeled on the Edo, Meiji, Taisho and Showa periods in Japanese history, enjoy a delicious matcha green tea flavored tiramisu, and watch an amazing projection mapping display. Transfer back to the hotel. (B, L)

Day 4: Mon, Dec 07 – TOKYO. After breakfast, depart the hotel for some free time at **Sugamo Jizodori Shopping Street**, an 800m long road filled with 200 shops and restaurants that are popular with the older generation and is affectionately known as “Grandma’s Harajuku.” Next, visit **Ameyoko**, a busy market street between the JR Okachimachi and JR Ueno Stations. The name “Ameyoko” is a short form for “ameya yokocho” (“candy store alley”), as candies were traditionally sold there. Alternatively, “ame” also stands for “America,” because a lot of American products used to be available there when the street was the site of a black market in

the years following WWII. Today, various products such as clothes, bags, cosmetics, fresh fish, dried food, and spices are sold along Ameyoko. Enjoy lunch here (on your own). After lunch, explore **Meiji Shrine**, the Shinto shrine dedicated to the deified spirits of the Emperor Meiji and his wife, Empress Shoken, who modernized Japan by transforming the country from an isolated feudal shogunate into a modern industrialized world power within a single generation. As you pass its massive torii gates, you’ll be surprised at the tranquil atmosphere you experience in the middle of bustling Tokyo! Next, visit the visually stimulating **Harajuku Shopping District**, which is centered around Takeshita Street. It is famed for its quirky boutiques, colorful accessories, affordable kawaii (cute) fashion, and iconic street food. Takeshita Dori is a narrow, roughly 400m-long street lined by shops, boutiques, cafés, and fast food outlets targeting Tokyo’s teenagers. Just south of Takeshita Street is **Omotesando**, a broad tree-line avenue referred to as Tokyo’s Champs-Élysées. Here, you’ll find famous brand name shops, cafés, and restaurants for a more adult clientele. On the ride back to the hotel, enjoy one of Tokyo’s most popular illuminations: the **Omotesando Illumination**. It features over 900,000 champagne gold-colored LED lights wrapped around the zelkova trees along the 1km-long street between the Jingumae and Omotesando crossings. Return to the hotel for an evening of leisure. (B)

Day 5: Tue, Dec 08 – TOKYO. Full day at leisure. The perfect day to relax and/or visit with family and friends. Enjoy shopping and dining in the bustling Shinjuku area and beyond. Your Local Guide will be available to assist as needed. (B)

Day 6: Wed, Dec 09 – TOKYO. Another day at leisure. Your Local Guide will be available to assist as needed. (B)

Day 7: Thur, Dec 10 – TOKYO – HANEDA – HONOLULU. Enjoy a morning of leisure. Then, depart the hotel to explore **Toyosu Senkyaku Banrai**, a shopping complex that recreates an Edo period neighborhood. Toyosu Senkyaku Banrai offers fresh food from the neighboring Toyosu Market and serves to showcase the best foods in Tokyo. Enjoy time for shopping and lunch (on your own), exploring the offerings at the numerous stalls. If you get tired, head up to the 8th floor and relax at the foot bath garden, which is free of charge to all visitors. A final shopping stop will be made at a **shopping mall**, before transferring to the Haneda International Airport for our return flight home. Depart from Haneda via Japan Airlines flt #72 at 9:55 pm and arrive in Honolulu at 9:40 am the same day. Aloha and welcome home! (B)
