Day 1: Sun, Oct 10 – HONOLULU. Depart Honolulu.

Day 2: Mon, Oct 11 – TOKYO, JAPAN – EMBARK RIVIERA. Arrive in Tokyo. Transfer to pier and embark the Riviera. Depart 5:00 pm. (D)

Day 3: Tue, Oct 12 – NAGOYA, JAPAN. Arrive 8:00 am. Depart 4:00 pm. A center of modern commerce, yet steeped in ancient history; visit the castle in the center of town, its golden orca statues are a symbol of the city. Explore Toyota's Museum of Technology and tour the Noritake Factory, where bargains on the fine china can be found. (B, L, D)

Day 4: Wed, Oct 13 – KYOTO (KOBE), JAPAN. Arrive 8:00 am. Depart 6:00 pm. Visit the breathtaking temples and shrines of Japan's old imperial capital, Kyoto, or explore ancient Nara, the cradle of Japanese arts, literature and crafts, with its magnificent shrines and temples that predate Kyoto's. Stroll through Nara Park, famed for its deer and impressive Kasuga Grand Shrine. Then travel on to Osaka and its famed castle. In Kobe, visit historic Himeji Castle, a huge edifice built entirely of wood and tile. (B, L, D)

Day 5: Thur, Oct 14 – BEPPU, JAPAN. Arrive 12:00 pm. Depart 9:00 pm. Backed by steep hills and mountains on the eastern coast of Kyushu Island, Beppu is known as Japan's top onsen hot spring resort city. Home to more than 2,000 onsens, this picturesque city gives you a chance to experience its onsens, mud baths, steam baths, and even traditional Japanese black sand baths. To top it off, eight unique hot springs, collectively named the "Onsen Hells," offer entertainingly distinctive attractions. On chilly days, visitors are treated to the otherworldly view of steam rising throughout the city. (B, L, D)

Day 6: Fri, Oct 15 – KITAKYUSHU, JAPAN. Arrive 9:00 am. Depart 7:00 pm. An international trading port since the 19th century, Moji is a seaside town with a nostalgic flair that's easy to explore on foot. Numerous historic structures have been well-preserved, so you'll spot architecture dating to the Meiji and Taisho periods from 1868–1926. Go for a stroll along the waterfront promenade lined with historic buildings, cafés, restaurants and museums. Stop at the former Moji Customs Building, which now houses a free art gallery or Kaikyo Plaza, where you'll find local handicrafts and artisanal goods. Don't miss Mojiko Station, built in 1914 and one of the only remaining wooden rail stations in Japan. (B, L, D)

Day 7: Sat, Oct 16 – BUSAN, SOUTH KOREA. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 5:00 pm. From trendy cafes and famous fish markets to sacred temples and traditional tea ceremonies, Busan, the second largest city in South Korea is bursting with flavors and culture. Take a walk in the relaxing Yongdusan Park while admiring the various species of trees and a view of the Busan Tower. At the Hongbeopsa Temple, explore the renowned large Buddha statues at the Main Buddha Hall while walking along a water lily path, or experience a traditional Korean tea ceremony conducted by one of their monks. (B, L, D)

Day 8: Sun, Oct 17 – JEJU, SOUTH KOREA. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 2:00 pm. Known as the "Island of the Gods," Jeju offers beautiful beaches as well as breathtaking views from Hallasan, the highest peak in South Korea. The volcanic island features one of the finest lava tube systems of caves in the world and has been named a UNESCO World Heritage Site for its dramatic landscapes of outstanding beauty. Walk the scenic path to the Cheonjiyeon Waterfall, one of the island's most famous attractions, and watch history and culture come alive at the open-air Jeju Folk Village Museum. (B, L, D)

Day 9: Mon, Oct 18 – SEOUL (INCHEON), SOUTH KOREA. Arrive 9:00 am. Depart 7:00 pm. Travel to Seoul and discover its 5,000-year-old heritage amidst the ultra-modern high-rises. Visit the magnificent

14th century Gyeongbok Palace and stone pagoda, the National Museum and the bustling antique district. Or spend a day in the serene atmosphere of a Zen Buddhist temple and a historic Korean village. Tour the DMZ and rediscover the drama of recent history. Or simply wander the fish market and promenade at Incheon. (B, L, D)

Day 10: Tue, Oct 19 – AT SEA. (B, L, D)

Day 11: Wed, Oct 20 – SHANGHAI, CHINA. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 7:00 pm. See the amazing contrasts of this burgeoning city, from the broad European-style Bund to the soaring ultra-modern buildings. Visit the magnificent art museum and the renowned 16th century Yu Yuan Gardens. Enjoy the city by night, see an acrobatic show, browse in local markets or take a trip to one of the famed garden cities of Suzhou or Wuxi. (B, L, D)

Day 12: Thur, Oct 21 – AT SEA. (B, L, D)

Day 13: Fri, Oct 22 – KAGOSHIMA, JAPAN. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 4:00 pm. Visit the exquisite Iso-Teien Garden and its villa, built in 1660, and enjoy its gorgeous views before a short ferry ride to smoking Sakurajima for a close-up view of the volcano and its lava fields. Or journey into the countryside to Chiran and its well-preserved streets lined with samurai homes. Enjoy the beautiful landscape of Lake Ikeda and the stunning vistas of the Satsuma Peninsula. (B, L, D)

Day 14: Sat, Oct 23 – KOCHI, JAPAN. Arrive 10:00 am. Depart 6:00 pm. Not the typical Japanese city, small and compact Kochi has gained a well-deserved reputation for its exuberant, easy-going spirit and vibrant food scene. The city is the birthplace of the legendary samurai Sakamoto Ryoma, who created an alliance that eventually brought down the Tokugawa Shogunate and is now commemorated in a memorial museum. In the city center, don't miss the well-preserved hilltop Kochi Castle to explore the grounds where the city was established in 1601. You might continue your downtown explorations at one of the many pedestrian shopping arcades or at a restaurant to try Kochi's most famous dish: katsuo-no-tataki, a savory dish of grilled, ponzu-marinated skipjack tuna, or bonito fish. (B, L, D)

Day 15: Sun, Oct 24 – SHIMIZU, JAPAN. Arrive 1:00 pm. Depart 8:00 pm. In the shadow of Mt. Fuji, Shimizu is one of the most beautiful ports in Japan. Walk through the pine groves of Miho, home to a 650-year-old Japanese black pine, or enjoy spectacular views of Mt. Fuji from the lush, forested hill of Nihondaira. Take in the seascapes on a bay cruise, or learn of undersea delights at Japan's first sushi museum. For a historic angle, get a glimpse at feudal life in Japan in 200 B.C. at the archaeological site of Toro. (B, L, D)

Day 16: Mon, Oct 25 – TOKYO (YOKOHAMA), JAPAN – DISEMBARK RIVIERA – HONOLULU. Arrive 7:00 am. Disembark Riviera. Depart Tokyo. Return flight to Honolulu. Aloha and welcome home! (B)
