Day 1: Wed, Mar 17 – HONOLULU. Depart Honolulu.

Day 2: Thur, Mar 18 – TOKYO, JAPAN. Arrive Tokyo. After entry formalities, transfer by coach to hotel in Tokyo. Upon arrival at the hotel, receive a boxed sandwich dinner. KEIO PLAZA HOTEL TOKYO (3 Nights) (D)

Day 3: Fri, Mar 19 – TOKYO. After a sumptuous buffet breakfast, take in the view of the surrounding city from the observation deck of the **Tokyo Skytree**. At just over 2,000 ft tall, it is the tallest tower in Tokyo. Rising 350m above the ground, the Tokyo Skytree Tembo Deck offers a 360 degree panoramic view of Tokyo. Enjoy lunch (on your own) at **Tokyo Solamachi**, located at the base of the Tokyo Skytree, where a variety of restaurant and food choices are available. After lunch, take on a fun-filled, hands-on activity, as you learn how to **make your own furin (Japanese wind chime)**. Start by blowing glass into a round and finish by hand painting your personal treasure. Next, explore **teamLab Borderless: MORI Building DIGITAL ART MUSEUM**, a world of artworks without boundaries. Artworks move out of rooms, relate to other works, influence each other, and at times intermingle, without boundaries, creating one continuous world without boundaries – wander, explore with intention, discover, and create a world with others in this immersive experience. Enjoy a **special Yakatabune dinner** before returning to the hotel for the evening. (B, D)

Day 4: Sat, Mar 20 – TOKYO. Day at leisure. The perfect day to relax and/or visit with family and friends in Tokyo. Your local guide will be available to assist as needed. (B)

Day 5: Sun, Mar 21 – TOKYO – EMBARK OCEANIA NAUTICA. After a delicious breakfast at the hotel, depart the hotel for the **Odaiba area**, where you'll have time for shopping and lunch (on your own). Then transfer to the pier for embarkation on the Oceania Nautica. Depart 5:00 pm. (B, D)

Day 6: Mon, Mar 22 – AT SEA. (B, L, D)

Day 7: Tue, Mar 23 – HAKODATE (HOKKAIDO), JAPAN. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 3:00 pm. In 1854 Hakodate became Japan's first port to open to foreign trade as the country's era of isolationism came to an end. The resulting influx of traders and merchants from Russia, China, and Western countries imprinted the city with a mélange of cultural styles that now distinguish Hakodate's unique atmosphere. Star-shaped Goryokaku Fort was designed in the European style, even as its purpose was to defend Japan from foreign imperialism, and is now flanked by thousands of native cherry trees. The Russian Orthodox Church stands just blocks from the Chinese Memorial Hall, and nearby you'll find traditional Japanese markets selling the signature Hakodate shio ramen, a salty noodle dish that is the city's specialty. Beef lovers will want to try the famously flavorful Hakodate Onuma beef, which happily can be savored in restaurants overlooking scenic Lake Onuma. (B, L, D)

Day 8: Wed, Mar 24 – NIIGATA, JAPAN. Arrive 8:00 am. Depart 4:00 pm. Niigata, on Honshu's west coast, sits along the Shinano River, with the iconic Bandai Bridge linking the seaport to the city center. The Niigata City Art Museum highlights modern Japanese works and local cultural heritage. Nature lovers can visit the Niigata Prefectural Botanical Garden, home to stunning native flora. History enthusiasts will enjoy the Niigata History Museum, set in a former merchant's house, while Hakusan Jinja Shrine, dating to the 14th century, offers insight into the region's Shinto traditions. (B, L, D)

Day 9: Thur, Mar 25 – KANAZAWA, JAPAN. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 5:00 pm. Kanazawa is the capital of Ishikawa Prefecture, on Japan's central Honshu Island. It's known for well-preserved Edo-era districts, art museums and regional handicrafts. Kenrokuen Garden, begun in the 17th century, is celebrated for its classic

landscape designs incorporating ponds and streams. Adjacent Kanazawa Castle was built in the 1580s, after the defeat of the Peasant's Kingdom, Japan's only Buddhist fiefdom. (B, L, D)

Day 10: Fri, Mar 26 – SAKAIMINATO, JAPAN. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 4:00 pm. Sakaiminato, located in Tottori Prefecture, Japan, is a hidden gem that offers a unique blend of cultural heritage, natural beauty, and modern attractions. This charming port city is renowned for its connection to the famous manga artist Shigeru Mizuki, making it a must-visit for manga enthusiasts. (B, L, D)

Day 11: Sat, Mar 27 – BUSAN, SOUTH KOREA. Arrive 8:00 am. Depart 4:00 pm. From trendy cafes and famous fish markets to sacred temples and traditional tea ceremonies, Busan, the second largest city in South Korea is bursting with flavors and culture. Take a walk in the relaxing Yongdusan Park while admiring the various species of trees and a view of the Busan Tower. At the Hongbeopsa farming temple, explore the renowned large Buddha statues at the Main Buddha Hall while walking along a water lily path, or experience a traditional Korean tea ceremony conducted by one of their monks. (B, L, D)

Day 12: Sun, Mar 28 – NAGASAKI, JAPAN. Arrive 8:00 am. Depart 6:00 pm. Discover remnants of old Nagasaki beside the modern city. Visit the Nagasaki Peace Park and Nagasaki Atomic Bomb Museum. Or travel to Arita, home of magnificent Japanese ceramics, and tour famous Kakiemon Kiln, which continues a 400-year-old tradition. Experience feudal Japan and the natural wonders of Shimabara Peninsula with its volcanoes and onsen hot springs. (B, L, D)

Day 13: Mon, Mar 29 – AT SEA. (B, L, D)

Day 14: Tue, Mar 30 – SHIMIZU, JAPAN. Arrive 9:00 am. Depart 9:00 pm. In the shadow of Mt. Fuji, Shimizu is one of the most beautiful ports in Japan. Walk through the pine groves of Miho, home to a 650-year-old Japanese black pine, or enjoy spectacular views of Mt. Fuji from the lush, forested hill of Nihondaira. Take in the seascapes on a bay cruise, or learn of undersea delights at Japan's first sushi museum. For a historic angle, get a glimpse at feudal life in Japan in 200 B.C. at the archaeological site of Toro. (B, L, D)

Day 15: Wed, Mar 31 – TOKYO, JAPAN – DISEMBARK OCEANIA NAUTICA – TOKYO – HONOLULU. Arrive 7:00 am. Disembark Nautica. After disembarkation, enjoy a full day of shopping! Begin the day at **Toyosu Senkyaku Banrai**, a shopping complex that recreates an Edo period neighborhood. Toyosu Senkyaku Banrai offers fresh food from the neighboring Toyosu Market and serves to showcase the best foods in Tokyo. Enjoy time for shopping and lunch (on your own), exploring the offerings at the numerous stalls. If you get tired, head up to the 8th floor and relax at the foot bath garden, which is free of charge to all visitors. Then visit **Ameyoko**, a busy market street between Okachimachi and Ueno Stations. The name "Ameyoko" is a short form for "Ameya Yokocho" ("Candy Store Alley"), as candies were traditionally sold there. Alternatively, "ame" also stands for "America," because a lot of American products used to be available there when the street was the site of a black market in the years following WWII. Today, various products such as clothes, bags, cosmetics, fresh fish, dried food, and spices are sold along Ameyoko. **Ario Kitasuna**, a shopping center with over 100 specialty shops. This includes CAN★DO, a 100 yen store, and Halos Garden – an amusement center for the whole family featuring the latest gaming machines, hands-on sweet making, a large ball pit, and more! You'll have ample time to shop before transferring to the airport for the return flight home. Depart Tokyo and arrive in Honolulu the same day. Aloha and welcome home! (B)
