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Day 1: HONOLULU. Depart Honolulu via Korean Air.

Day 2: INCHEON. Arrive at Incheon International Airport. After entry formalities, enjoy a special galbitang (beef short rib soup) dinner at a local restaurant in town before transferring to your hotel. NEST HOTEL INCHEON (1 Night) (D)

Day 3: INCHEON — YONGIN — SUWON — SOKCHO. After breakfast, depart Incheon for Sokcho. En route, stop at the **Korean Folk Village** in Yongin, a living museum that recreates the lifestyle from several centuries ago. Then, explore the **Hwaseong Fortress**, a fortification surrounding the center of Suwon city with massive 5.74-kilometer walls. Enjoy dinner in Sokcho before checking into the hotel for the evening. RAMADA SOKCHO (2 Nights) (B, D)

Day 4: SOKCHO. Visit **Mt. Seorak National Park**, one of Korea's most iconic parks, and home to Mt. Seorak, Korea's third largest mountain. After lunch, visit the **filming site of the K-drama Autumn in my Heart**. Hike the **Shinheungsa Temple** area before taking the **cable car to Gwongeumseong Rock**. Enjoy dinner before retiring for the evening. (B, L, D)

Day 5: SOKCHO — ANDONG — GYEONGJU. Start the day with a visit to **Andong Hahoe Village**, a traditional village that preserves Joseon Dynasty-style architecture, folk traditions, and other historic valuables. After lunch, visit a local farm and **pick fruit** at its peak of ripeness. Transfer to Gyeongju for dinner. LAHAN SELECT GYEONGJU (2 Nights) (B, L, D)

Day 6: GYEONGJU. This morning, spend some time exploring **Bulguksa Temple**, a major Buddhist temple complex located on the slopes of Mt. Tohamsan and one of Korea's best known temples. **Seokguram Grotto** is one of the world's finest shrines of Buddha. Next, tour the **Gyeongju National Museum**, a museum largely devoted to relics of the Silla kingdom. Then, visit **Tumuli Park** (also known as the Daereungwon Tomb Complex), a well-maintained park containing 23 burial mounds of the ancient Silla Dynasty. Finally, visit **Donggung Palace** and **Wolji Pond**, a historic secondary palace complex from the Unified Silla Kingdom era, which served as a banquet site for important national events and important visitors. (B, L)

Day 7: GYEONGJU — BUSAN — JEJU ISLAND. Transfer to Busan. **Busan Tower** is a symbol of Busan that stands proudly at a height of 120 meters, offering a stunning view of the city. Next, explore **Jagalchi Market**, Korea's largest seafood market. Then explore **Gukje Market** (also known as Nampodong International Market), Busan's largest traditional open-air market, where shops sell a wide range of items at both wholesale and retail prices. Transfer to the airport and **fly to Jeju Island**, known for its beach resorts and volcanic landscape. Enjoy dinner (on your own) before transferring to the hotel for the evening. GRAND HYATT JEJU (2 Nights) (B, L)

Day 8: JEJU ISLAND. Begin the day with a visit to Yongduam Beach and its intriguing **Yongduam Rock** that resembles a roaring dragon. Continue to **Hallim Park** and explore its botanical gardens, folklore villages, and unique lava tube caves. Then, visit the **OSULLOC Tea Museum**, which showcases the rich history of Korean tea. OSULLOC started cultivating its fields on Jeju Island, an optimal natural setting for growing tea, in order to revive the Korean tea culture and has established itself as Korea's number one tea brand. The museum also includes a cafe and shop where you can sample and purchase an assortment of tea-based products. After, visit **Cheonjiyeon Waterfall**, one of Jeju's main tourist attractions. Finally, visit the scenic **Jusangjeollidae** and see its vertical pillar-shaped volcanic rock formations. Return to the hotel for dinner. (B, L, D)



Day 9: JEJU ISLAND — SEOUL. View the surrounding countryside from **Seongsan Ilchulbong (Sunrise Peak)**, a volcanic tuff cone that rises to an elevation of 182 meters above sea level and features a distinctive bowl-shaped crater. Before departing Jeju Island, learn about the haenyeo (Jeju's female divers) at the **Haenyeo Museum**. The museum houses exhibits donated by the haenyeo, featuring artifacts, a replica haenyeo house, and more. Depart Jeju and **fly to Seoul**. Enjoy dinner before transferring to the hotel for the evening. NOVOTEL SUITES AMBASSADOR SEOUL YONGSAN (3 Nights) (B, L, D)

Day 10: SEOUL. Begin the day with a tour of the **DMZ (Demilitarized Zone)**, the heavily fortified buffer strip dividing the Korean Peninsula, symbolizing both war and peace. Then, spend some time at **Costco**, before exploring **Myeongdong**, the trendsetting shopping district of Korean fashion. The vibrant streets are also lined with vendors offering popular Korean snacks. Enjoy dinner in the area (on your own). Tonight you're in for a treat! **NANTA** is a non-verbal show filled with high-energy rhythms that bring traditional Korean percussion to life in a wildly comedic cooking performance. As they "cook," the cast turns everyday kitchen items — pots, pans, dishes, brooms, and even each other — into percussion instruments. (B, L)

Day 11: SEOUL. Immerse yourself in Korean culture as you dress-up in a **hanbok**, Korea's national clothing, for a **traditional wedding ceremony**. Then, let your creative side shine as you learn a **traditional paper craft**. What a great souvenir of this trip! At **Deoksugung Palace**, watch the **changing of the guard ceremony**. Then, spend some time shopping at **Namdaemun Market**, the largest traditional market in Korea. Enjoy a buffet Farewell Dinner tonight. (B, L, D)

Day 12: SEOUL — INCHEON — HONOLULU. After a morning of leisure, **learn how to make kimchi and bulgogi (barbecued beef)**. Enjoy your yummy creations for lunch! Then, get some last minute shopping done at **Insadong**, a historic shopping district renowned for its abundance of traditional Korean art, antiques, and cultural experiences. Transfer to the airport for your return flight to Honolulu. Depart Incheon International Airport via Korean Air. Arrive in Honolulu the same day. Aloha and welcome home! (B, L)
