Day 1: Tue, Jan 19 - HONOLULU. Depart Honolulu.

Day 2: Wed, Jan 20 — IN TRANSIT.

Day 3: Thur, Jan 21 – BUENOS AIRES, ARGENTINA. Welcome to Buenos Aires! Meet your Argentinian Tour Director at the airport. First stop will be made in La Boca which is Buenos Aires' most colorful barrio. It was settled and built up by Italian immigrants along the Riachuelo, a sinuous waterway. Much of La Boca's color, springs from the brightly painted houses and corrugated metal roofs of the Caminito, a popular pedestrian walk and former rail terminus that takes its name from a popular tango. At the Caminito, painters are offering their pictures representing Caminito Street or typical tango scenes. At the end of the Caminito, guests will find a market offering handicrafts. Check into your accommodations (normal check-in times apply) and enjoy some free time until going to dinner at a local restaurant. LOI SUITES RECOLETA HOTEL or Similar (3 Nights) (D)

Day 4: Fri, Jan 22 — BUENOS AIRES — EXCURSION FIESTA GAUCHA. In Argentina ranches dedicated to cattle breeding and to growing grains are called Estancias. Today, enjoy a complete day at an estancia in the pampas, where Buenos Aires ends and the home of the gauchos begins! This full day is an ideal opportunity to absorb the atmosphere of rural life and a colorful feast in the heart of the pampas. Lunch includes world-renowned Argentine beef and a folklore show with music and dance. The day will end with demonstration of typical activities at an estancia: regional games on horseback such as the carrera de sortijas, where two teams gallop at full tilt under a wooden arch and try to pass a pin through a small ring hanging from the arch. Return to Buenos Aires for an evening of leisure. (B, L)

Day 5: Sat, Jan 23 — BUENOS AIRES. Leave Buenos Aires and drive to Tigre, located about 19 miles from the capital. Pass by the northern suburbs and along Libertador Avenue where you can see the residential government house in Olivos. Then, stop in San Isidro to see the historical center, the beautiful square, and the stunning **Cathedral**. Continue your drive to Tigre, a popular weekend getaway for many "portenos" that boasts many summer homes as well as yacht and rowing clubs. Take a one-hour boat excursion along the Parana Delta and its channels, rivers, streams, and numerous islands. Appreciate the lush vegetation with views of Buenos Aires on the horizon. Lunch at a local restaurant. Enjoy some free time this afternoon, before your special evening at a **famous** Tango club. The Tango and Argentina go hand in hand and tonight you will visit a local milonga (tango house), where professional tango dancers teach the traditional techniques of the Argentine Tango. After your lesson, enjoy a dinner featuring Argentine steaks and other local specialties. Top off the evening when the professionals delight you with a Tango Show featuring the dance as it has evolved. (B, L, D)

Day 6: Sun, Jan 24 – BUENOS AIRES – EMBARK INSIGNIA. This morning start by visiting San Telmo which is an artist's quarter where bohemians find large spaces at low rents. San Telmo is the best kept historical neighborhood and oldest district of Buenos Aires. Here you can stroll around Plaza Dorrego, where you can find many antique shops. Then visit Recoleta. Among the areas to which the upper-class Portenos of San Telmo relocated after the yellow fever epidemic of the 1870s, Recoleta is today one of Buenos Aires' most fashionable districts. At the cemetery of Recoleta you will find the grave of Eva Duarte who became famous as Eva Peron (Evita). The cemetery is the center of this aristocratic district. See the Municipal Cultural Center, elegant boutiques and excellent restaurants, surrounded by centennial trees. During the weekend on the Plaza Francia a handicraft market is held, and many street artists are representing their skills. Transfer to pier and embark Insignia. Depart 6:00 pm. (B. D)

Day 9: Wed, Jan 27 — PUERTO MADRYN, ARGENTINA. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 4:00 pm. Explore this wildlife paradise and its surrounding quaint towns. Visit an exuberant sea lion colony, watch for nesting cormorants and magnificent elephant seals, and observe sheep-shearing on an estancia. Or experience a walk through a colony of Magellanic penguins and myriad species of native seabirds. (B, L, D)

Day 11: Fri, Jan 29 – PORT STANLEY, FALKLAND ISLANDS. Arrive 9:00 am. Depart 6:00 pm. Discover this quaint town, its cathedral, authentic English pubs, neat gardens, war memorials and fascinating landscape. Set off for an adventure on this South Atlantic island and visit a penguin colony and watch for albatross and skuas or go to a sprawling sheep farm. (B, L, D)

Day 16: Wed, Feb 03 — CRUISING DRAKE PASSAGE. (B, L, D)

Day 17: Thur, Feb 04 – USHUAIA, ARGENTINA. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 5:00 pm. Witness the spectacular beauty of Tierra del Fuego's lakes, lush forests, soaring mountains and flora and fauna by train, via all-terrain vehicle or on horseback. Enjoy the expansive views from Garibaldi Pass and watch for sea lions and albatross along the Beagle Channel. (B, L, D)

Day 18: Fri, Feb 05 — PUNTA ARENAS, CHILE. Arrive 11:00 am. Overnight in Port. Explore the town and its history and enjoy stunning views over the Strait of Magellan to fabled Tierra del Fuego. Discover the scenic Patagonian countryside and visit a local sheep farm. The highlight is the Magellanic penguin rookery at Otway Sound. (B, L, D)

Day 19: Sat, Feb 06 - PUNTA ARENAS, CHILE. Depart 7:00 pm. (B, L, D)

Day 21: Mon, Feb 08 - CRUISING THE CHILEAN FJORDS. (B, L, D)

Day 22: Tue, Feb 09 — LAGUNA SAN RAFAEL, CHILE. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 7:00 pm. Be awed by the huge and incredible San Valentin Glacier, one of four that move in every direction from soaring San Valentin Mountain. As your catamaran enters the lagoon through a narrow opening, you'll pass floating pieces of ice. Before you stands the brilliant and dense glacier. Keep your camera handy and listen for the distinctive crack and resounding crash of the glacier calving. (B, L, D)

Day 23: Wed, Feb 10 — PUERTO CHACABUCO, CHILE. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 4:00 pm. Experience a bit of rugged Patagonia with a drive into the Andes Mountains through a stunning valley to the Rio Simpson National Reserve and the town of Coyhaique. Or visit the magnificent private Aiken del Sur Park with its many waterfalls, wetlands, forests and mosses. (B, L, D)

Day 24: Thur, Feb 11 — CASTRO (CHILDE ISLAND), CHILE. Arrive 10:00 am. Depart 9:00 pm. Discover the pastoral beauty of Chile's Chiloe Archipelago and lose yourself in the charming villages on Chiloe Island, where the port of Castro is the largest town and island capital. Here you'll find one of the 16 wooden churches built by Jesuit and Franciscan Catholics from the 17th to 19th centuries that together compose a UNESCO World Heritage site. Castro is also fairly close to Chiloe National Park, where you can find hiking trails to suit all levels of fitness. If you want to load



up on carbs before you go, be sure to have some potatoes — varieties grown on Chiloe Island are among the oldest cultivated tubers in the world. (B, L, D)

Day 25: Fri, Feb 12 – PUERTO MONTT, CHILE. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 3:00 pm. Enjoy the Bavarian ambiance of the Lake District as you visit the edge of the Patagonian wilderness, seeing pristine wood forests, vast lakes, soaring waterfalls, snow-capped peaks and spectacular vistas. (B, L, D)

Day 26: Sat, Feb 13 - AT SEA.~(B, L, D)

Day 27: Sun, Feb 14 — VALPARAISO/SANTIAGO DE CHILE, CHILE — DISEMBARK INSIGNIA. Meet your Chilean Tour Director as you disembark from the Oceania Insignia. Step back into the 16th century as your Local Guide traces the city's history and heritage. Start at La Moneda, the official Government Palace, before visiting the Plaza de Armas, with a visit to the 18th century cathedral. Lunch at a local restaurant. This afternoon includes entrance to the Museo Chileno de Arte Precolombino. Enjoy dinner at your hotel this evening. DOUBLETREE BY HILTON SANTIAGO KENNEDY (2 Nights) (B, L, D)

Day 28: Mon, Feb 15 — SANTIAGO DE CHILE — EXCURSION TO MAIPO VALLEY. Travel to the Maipo Valley. located on the eastern side of the Andes Mountains, for a half-day tour to the famous Undurraga Winery, where a local guide demonstrates how Chile's world-famous wine is produced. The winery was founded by Don Francisco Undurraga, a pioneer of wine making, in 1885. The Chilean is the only "pre-phylloxera" vine remaining in the world. Miraculously, Chile was not affected by the beetle that completely destroyed European vineyards toward the end of the 19th century. The vineyard is distributed in four properties with a total area of 2,500 acres. Visit the old bodegas and the beautiful Casona, learn about the growth and storage of fine wines, and enjoy a wine tasting. Lunch in the Maipo Valley. Return to Santiago, balance of the day is at your leisure. (B, L)

Day 29: Tue, Feb 16 — SANTIAGO DE CHILE — IN TRANSIT. Travel outside the city to visit an alpaca farm. Meet the animals and learn about the responsible breeding of alpacas to the transformation of their fiber into yarns and garments of exceptional softness and quality. You will also visit the spinning mill and weaving workshop, as well as have time to explore their boutique. Tonight, enjoy a spectacular drive through illuminated downtown Santiago before reaching a restaurant popular among the locals. After a traditional Bali Hai dinner, relax and enjoy a lively folklore show of Chilean music and dance, showcasing the regional styles from the north to the south of Chile, like the typical country-dance of the Huaso (Chilean cowboys) and the exotic Easter Island/Polynesian Islands performances. Transfer to the airport for the flight home. (B, D)

Day 30: Wed, Feb 17 — HONOLULU. Aloha and welcome home!
