OVERVIEW: Okinawa's distinct culture reflects its past as the independent Ryukyu Kingdom. The islands remained a separate country until the kingdom was abolished and incorporated into Japan as the Okinawa Prefecture in 1879. Okinawa's castles, known as "Gusuku" in the Okinawan language, are some of the clearest symbols of its unique heritage. In 2000, five castles and four related sites were recognized together as a UNESCO World Heritage Site under the collective title of "Gusuku Sites and Related Properties of the Kingdom of Ryukyu."

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Day 1: Thur, Mar 11 — HONOLULU. Depart Honolulu via Japan Airlines flt #73 at 12:05 pm.

Day 2: Fri, Mar 12 — HANEDA. Arrive at the Haneda International Airport at 4:05 pm. After entry formalities, walk to your hotel connected to the airport terminal. Enjoy a buffet dinner at the hotel. HOTEL VILLA FONTAINE GRAND HANEDA AIRPORT (1 Night) (D)

Day 3: Sat, Mar 13 — HANEDA — NAHA. After a breakfast buffet at your hotel, transfer back to the Haneda Airport. Enjoy a bento box at the domestic departure gate. Depart Haneda Domestic Airport via Japan Airlines flt #915 at 11:55 am and arrive at the Naha International Airport at 2:45 pm. After arriving in Naha, visit **Shuri Castle** (Shurijo), the most important castle of the Ryukyu Kingdom, serving both as the central government office and royal residence. While here, dress up in **Ryusou Ryukyu kimonos** for a group photo! Enjoy dinner at a local restaurant, before walking to your hotel. HOTEL COLLECTIVE (2 Nights) (B, L, D)

Day 4: Sun, Mar 14 — NAHA — ITOMAN — NAHA. Coral is central to the history and culture of the Okinawan Islands. Coral fossils are used to create unique works of art across the region. Try your hand at bringing your own art to life when you learn how to decorate a tote bag using a **coral dyeing** technique done only in Okinawa. Next, have free time at **San-A Naha Main Place**, the largest shopping mall in Naha, to shop and enjoy lunch (on your own). After lunch, visit the **Himeyuri Peace Museum**, which details what Okinawans endured during and after World War II. The museum also honors the female high school students who were forced to work in army field hospitals under horrific conditions. Survivor testimonials from the Battle of Okinawa provide detailed, painful first-hand accounts. Next is the **Okinawa Peace Memorial Park**, situated on **Mabuni Hill**, the site where the Battle of Okinawa ended. Return to the hotel for an evening of leisure. (B)

*One bag will be held at the hotel in Naha. Prepare a bag for a one night stay in Manza.

Day 5: Mon, Mar 15 — NAHA — ONNA — KITANAKAGUSUKU — MANZA. After breakfast, we head north to Onna and spend the morning at **Ryukyu Mura**, a small theme park about Okinawan culture in the form of a recreated village from the time of the Ryukyu Kingdom. The highlight of Ryukyu Mura is the eisa show, a form of folk dance that is performed to honor the spirits of one's ancestors. Then, stop at **AEON MALL Okinawa Rycom** for shopping and lunch (on your own). Finally, we visit an **awamori (rice liquor) factory** to learn the unique process involved in making awamori. Awamori is the signature alcoholic beverage of Okinawa. Enjoy dinner at the hotel tonight. ANA INTERCONTINENTAL MANZA BEACH RESORT (1 Night) (B, D)

Day 6: Tue, Mar 16 — MANZA — NAKIJIN — MOTOBU — KYODA — NAHA. After a buffet breakfast, explore the ruins of **Nakijin Castle**, a designated UNESCO World Heritage Site, and learn about the history of Okinawa. Then, enjoy a visit to the **Okinawa Churaumi Aquarium**, one of the largest and most renowned aquariums in the world. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant, before making a stop at **Michi-no-Eki**

KYODA for a chance to stretch your legs and get a little shopping done. KYODA offers a wide variety of specialties from the northern region of Okinawa, including hard-to-find products from Okinawa's remote islands. Upon arrival in Naha, the remainder of the day is at your leisure. The Local Guide will have suggestions for dinner tonight. HOTEL COLLECTIVE (3 Nights) (B, L)

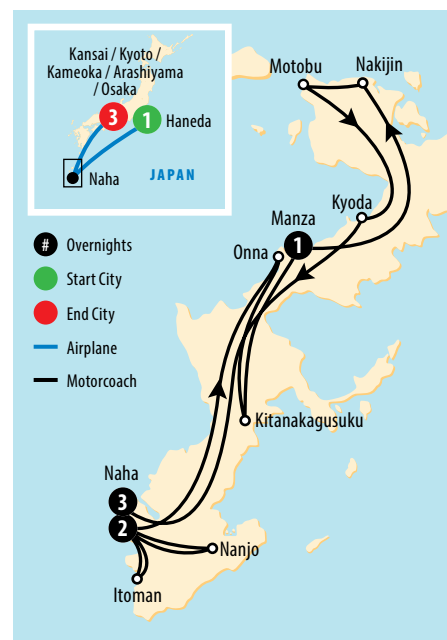
Day 7: Wed, Mar 17 — NAHA. Full day at leisure. The perfect day to relax and/or visit with family and friends. Don't miss out on the numerous shopping opportunities at Kokusai-dori, the main shopping street in Naha, where you can find a Don Quijote open until 3:00 am every day! Your Local Guide will be available to assist as needed. (B)

Day 8: Thur, Mar 18 — NAHA — NANJO — NAHA. Start the day with a visit to **Okinawa World**, a theme park about Okinawan culture. The park's main attractions are **Gyokusendo Cave**, **Kingdom Village**, and **Habu (Snake) Museum**. Gyokusendo Cave is the longest cave in the southern part of Okinawa and the second longest cave in the entire country. Kingdom Village is a replica of a traditional Ryukyu village, featuring workshops on traditional Okinawan crafts such as weaving, dyeing, sugar cane processing, instrument making, and glass blowing. Many workshops offer hands-on experiences and tours, allowing visitors to see how the craftsmen create their art. Colorful Ryukyu glass is one of those must have souvenirs when visiting Okinawa, so be sure to check out the **Ryukyu glass factory**! Enjoy a buffet lunch while here. Before returning to Naha, let your creative side loose when **you paint a shisa**, a traditional cultural artifact and decoration that resembles a cross between a lion and a dog, often seen in pairs. A great souvenir of this trip! Return to the hotel in Naha for some time to relax before enjoying dinner at a local restaurant. (B, L, D)

Day 9: Fri, Mar 19 — NAHA — KANSAI — KYOTO. This morning, we depart Naha and fly to Kansai. Depart the Naha Airport via Japan Transocean Air flt #4 at 11:20 am. Arrive at the Kansai Domestic Airport at 1:15 pm. Transfer by coach to your hotel in Kyoto. The remainder of your day is at your leisure. Your hotel is surrounded by department stores, specialty stores, and restaurants. The Local Guide will have suggestions for dinner. MIYAKO HOTEL KYOTO HACHIJO (3 Nights) (B)

Day 10: Sat, Mar 20 — KYOTO. Start the day at **Sanjusangen-do**, a Buddhist temple famous for its 1,001 statues of Kannon, the goddess of compassion. Then, explore **Nijo Castle**, which are arguably the best surviving examples of architecture from Japan's feudal era. After lunch at a local restaurant, **learn how to make wagashi** (traditional Japanese sweets). Then, try your hand at **yuzen dyeing**, one of Kyoto's traditional craft dyeing techniques. Since the patterns are dyed by placing a stencil over a piece of fabric, such as a tote bag, you can make an authentic piece, even if this is your first time. A great souvenir of this tour! Return to the hotel for a buffet dinner. (B, L, D)

Day 11: Sun, Mar 21 — KYOTO — KAMEOKA — ARASHIYAMA — KYOTO. After breakfast, travel aboard the **Sagano Torokko Ressha (Sagano Romantic Train)** from Kameoka to Arashiyama. In **Arashiyama**, enjoy



free time for a leisurely stroll around the area, shop for world-famous Arashiyama bamboo products, or explore the famous Arashiyama Bamboo Forests. After lunch, return to Kyoto and visit **Kinkakuji (Temple of the Golden Pavilion)**, a Zen temple whose top two floors are completely covered in gold leaf. The remainder of the evening is at your leisure. (B, L)

Day 12: Mon, Mar 22 — KYOTO — OSAKA — KANSAI — HONOLULU. After a morning of leisure, visit **Kuromon Ichiba Market**, a lively covered market stretching 580 meters through Osaka's Chuo Ward. The market is famous for its fresh seafood, fruits and vegetables, meats, dried fish, pickles, and confectionery. Next, visit Dotonbori and Shinsaibashi, a couple of interconnected districts known as one of Osaka's most popular tourist destinations. **Dotonbori** is a lively shopping and entertainment district along the Dotonbori Canal, while nearby **Shinsaibashi** is Osaka's premier shopping area, blending chain stores and trendy boutiques with department stores and top designer labels. Enjoy lunch in the area (on your own). Spend time exploring **Osaka Castle**, arguably one of Osaka's most prominent landmarks. A final shopping stop will be made at **AEON MALL Rinku Sennan** before transferring to the Kansai International Airport for our return flight home. Depart Kansai via Japan Airlines flt #790 at 10:10 pm and arrive in Honolulu at 10:25 am the same day. Aloha and welcome home! (B)
