Day 1: Fri — HONOLULU. Depart Honolulu via Korean Air.

Day 2: Sat — INCHEON. Arrive at Incheon International Airport. After entry formalities, enjoy a special galbitang (beef short rib soup) dinner at a local restaurant before transferring to your hotel. NEST HOTEL INCHEON (2 Nights) (D)

Day 3: Sun — INCHEON. After a morning of leisure, enjoy lunch in **Incheon Chinatown**, the only official Chinatown in Korea. Visit the nearby **Jayu Park**, also known as Freedom Park, the country's first Western-style park. Set on a hill overlooking the city's harbor, the park features the Joseon–United States Centennial Monument honoring the 1882 Treaty of Peace, a prominent statue of General Douglas MacArthur, and a small zoo. Then, spend some time at **Costco** shopping and dining (on your own), before returning to the hotel, where the remainder of the day is at your leisure. The Local Guide will have suggestions for nearby dining and shopping. (B, L)

Day 4: Mon — INCHEON — GIMPO — JEJU ISLAND. Transfer to the Gimpo Airport and **fly to Jeju Island**. Transfer to the hotel, where dinner has been arranged. GRAND HYATT JEJU (4 Nights) (B, L, D)

Day 5: Tue — JEJU ISLAND. View the surrounding countryside from **Seongsan Ilchulbong (Sunrise Peak)**, a volcanic tuff cone that rises to an elevation of 182 meters above sea level and features a distinctive bowl-shaped crater. Next, learn about the haenyeo (Jeju's female divers) at the **Haenyeo Museum**. The museum showcases the history of haenyeo culture dating back to ancient times, with all exhibits donated by the haenyeo themselves. On display are a replica of a haenyeo's house and detailed exhibits on their food culture, upbringing, and semi-agricultural, semi-fishing way of life. Then, visit **Dongmun Traditional Market**, Jeju Island's largest, oldest, and most significant permanent traditional market. The market is renowned for its fresh seafood and local delicacies, including a wide array of household goods, souvenirs, and street foods. Return to the hotel and enjoy free time before dinner at the hotel. Take advantage of the many amenities the hotel has to offer (for a fee), including a 24 hour arcade, foreigners-only casino, Korean bathhouse, luxury spa, and more. An Emart



is conveniently located next door, offering a diverse selection of products from clothes and household goods to local foods. There is also a food court where you can order delicious affordable meals. (B, L, D)

Day 6: Wed — JEJU ISLAND. Begin the morning with a tour of **Hallim Park**, one of the most popular tourist spots on Jeju Island boasting over a million visitors each year. Stroll through one of the nine distinct areas of the botanical garden and explore the famous Hyeopjaeul and Ssangyonggul Lava Caves, known as the only two-dimensional caves in the world. Next, visit the **OSULLOC Tea Museum**, which showcases the rich history of Korean tea. OSULLOC started cultivating its fields on Jeju Island, an optimal natural setting for growing tea, in order to revive the Korean tea culture and has established itself as Korea's number one tea brand. There is also a café and shop where you can sample and purchase an assortment of tea-based products. Then, visit **Hwansang Forest Gotjawal Park**, a unique nature reserve showcasing a primeval forest that thrives on rugged lava rock rather than soil, creating an otherworldly landscape of exposed tree roots and basalt formations unlike typical inland forests. The forest is famous for being the filming location of BTS's *Young Forever Part 2* and f(x)'s *4 Walls* music videos. Finally, take a **tour of the Jeju Beer Company** and learn how the island's first local beer is produced using Jeju ingredients. At the end of the tour, you can sample the beers at the pub located on the third floor of the brewery building. Return to the hotel for an evening of leisure. (B, L)

Day 7: Thur — JEJU ISLAND. Enjoy a full day at leisure. It's the perfect chance to explore more of Jeju Island on your own, or simply relax at your luxurious hotel. The Local Guide will be available to assist with your plans. (B)

Day 8: Fri — JEJU ISLAND — BUSAN. Before departing Jeju Island, visit **Gwaneumsa Temple**, a historic Buddhist sanctuary on the northeastern slopes of Mt. Halla, one of Jeju's most visited areas. Known for its tranquil, secluded setting, it is approached via a scenic road lined with cedar trees and vibrant chrysanthemums. At the summit of the temple grounds, a large golden Buddha statue is framed by rows of small Lohan Buddhas. Transfer to the airport and **fly to Busan**. Enjoy dinner at a local restaurant before arriving at the hotel. PARADISE HOTEL BUSAN (2 Nights) (B, L, D)



Day 9: Sat — BUSAN. Start the day at **Haedong Yonggungsa Temple**, a 14th century seaside Buddhist temple complex dramatically perched on the northeastern coast of Busan, famed for its rare oceanfront setting, 108-step stone staircase, three-story pagoda standing on a rocky outcrop, and Buddhist sanctuary built inside a natural cave. Visitors come to admire traditional dancheong-painted halls, pray to Avalokiteshvara (the Bodhisattva of Compassion) in the Daeungjeon Main Hall, and watch the sunrise from Hamachi Rock. If the weather conditions are right, enjoy **sailing on a yacht** in the waters of Busan. Return early to the hotel, where the remainder of the day is at your leisure. The Local Guide will have suggestions for nearby dining and shopping opportunities. (B, L)

Day 10: Sun — BUSAN — SEOUL. Visit the **GAMCHEON Culture Village**, which was formed by refugees of the Korean War who built terraced homes on the foothills of the coastal mountain. Once a hillside slum, it was transformed into a vibrant artistic hub of colorful murals and sculptures through the Village Art Project, where students, artists, and residents decorated the village to revitalize the community. Then, head to **BIFF Square**, a well-known food paradise for street food lovers, plus a great place to go to shop for souvenirs. Many stalls sell Korean snacks such as tteokbokki, fish cake, and mandu, all within a reasonable price. One of the most popular specialties is ssat hotteok (sweet pancakes stuffed with seeds), often featured on TV shows — a must-try in Busan! After, ride the **Korea Train eXpress (KTX)**, Korea's high-speed rail system, to Seoul. Transfer to the hotel for the evening. NOVOTEL SUITES AMBASSADOR SEOUL YONGSAN (4 Nights) (B, L, D)

Day 11: Mon — SEOUL. **Lotte World Tower** soars 555 meters over Seoul with its 123 floors, making it Korea's first building to surpass 100 floors and one of the tallest in the world. A pair of double-deck elevators whisk visitors to Seoul Sky, the seven-floor observatory, in just 60 seconds. At its base is **Lotte World Mall**, a massive shopping and entertainment complex, recognized as one of South Korea's largest retail destinations. The complex brings together Lotte Duty Free and Avenuel, Korea's largest luxury department store, with a wide array of local and international retailers, major attractions and extensive dining options. Next, visit **Namdaemun Market**, the largest traditional market in Korea, offering everything from apparel and houseware items to food, specialty goods, and beyond. Home to more than 10,000 stores and 5,200 retailers, the market is known for its cheaper prices, as many shopowners manufacture their own goods, making it a prime destination for both wholesale and retail bargains. Then, explore **Myeongdong**, Seoul's famous shopping and fashion district, which



has long been the trendsetting center of Korean fashion. Major retailers like Shinsegae, Lotte Department Store, and numerous K-beauty flagship stores can be found in the pedestrian-friendly (car-free) area. The vibrant streets are also lined with vendors offering popular snacks like tteokbokki, Korean corn dogs, hotteok, and japchae. Enjoy time to shop and dine (on your own) in the area, before returning to the hotel for the evening. (B, L)

Day 12: Tue — SEOUL — ICHEON — YONGIN — SEOUL. **Icheon Ceramics Village** is renowned for producing high-quality, traditional Korean ceramics. Thanks to abundant local clay and materials, it became the center of pottery during the Joseon Dynasty and is especially noted for its white porcelain. Today, around 80 pottery factories and 300 kilns operate here, where visitors can watch the production process and purchase pieces directly from the artists. Then, visit **Ye's Park**, Korea's largest craft village with over 350 studios, allowing visitors to immerse themselves in the world of Korean handicrafts. While here, you'll have a chance to **make your own pottery**. Take pictures of your creation, as you will not be able to bring it home with you. After, head to the **Korean Folk Village** in Yongin, a living museum that recreates the lifestyle from the late Joseon Dynasty, where potters, weavers, blacksmiths, and other artisans who practice their trades in traditional fashion reside. The village features 260 traditional houses, an amphitheater for live cultural performances (such as folk music, dance, martial arts, and more), traditional craft workshops, and more. Tonight, enjoy a buffet Farewell Dinner. (B, L, D)

Day 13: Wed — SEOUL. Enjoy a full day of leisure. The perfect day to explore more of Seoul on your own or shop 'til you drop. The Local Guide will be available to assist with your plans. (B)

Day 14: Thur — SEOUL — INCHEON — HONOLULU. After a morning of leisure, **learn how to make ganjang dakgalbi (soy sauce marinated stir-fried chicken)**. The marinade usually combines soy sauce, minced garlic, sesame oil, a touch of sweetness (such as honey or sugar), and occasionally ginger. Unlike the spicy chili-based traditional dakgalbi, this soy sauce-based version is typically garlicky, sweet, and savory. Enjoy your yummy creation for lunch! After, get some last minute shopping done at **local mall**, before transferring to the Incheon International Airport for your return flight to Honolulu. Depart Incheon via Korean Air. Arrive in Honolulu the same day. Aloha and welcome home! (B, L)
