**Day 1: Mon, Apr 24** – HONOLULU. Depart Honolulu.

**Day 2: Tue, Apr 25** – TOKYO (YOKOHAMA), JAPAN – EMBARK RIVIERA. Arrive in Tokyo. Transfer to pier and embark the Riviera. Depart 7:00 pm. (D)

**Day 3: Wed, Apr 26** – HITACHINAKA, JAPAN. Arrive 8:00 am. Depart 5:00 pm. Hitachinaka is in one of the quieter parts of the Ibaraki Prefecture northeast of Tokyo. This region is known for its beauty, which can be enjoyed any number of ways. Drive to nearby Mt. Tsukuba, where you can go on an easy hike on the walking trails or take in the views from a cable car that travels partway up the mountain. For a more adventurous day, try bungee jumping off the Ryujin Suspension Bridge, a 1,200-foot-long pedestrian bridge over a lake nestled between tree-covered hills about an hour away from Hitachinaka. For a longer road trip, make your way through the countryside to fantastic Tokyo, about two hours away by train. (B, L, D)

**Day 4: Thur, Apr 27** – MIYAKO, JAPAN. Arrive 8:00 am. Depart 5:00 pm. Despite being engulfed by a 125-foot wave, Miyako has miraculously reemerged completely revitalized from the devastating tsunami of 2011. You'll find the area's natural beauty remains unspoiled, including stunning Jodogahama Beach, a white-pebbled stretch of coastline enhanced by jagged offshore rock formations that has been declared a National Place of Scenic Beauty. Navigate the picturesque, Japanese red pine-swathed coast in a sightseeing boat to Hachinohe-ana, an ethereal sea grotto that grants wishes, and cap your exploration at the bustling Miyako Fish Market for a taste of local delicacies including crab, uni (sea urchin), and salmon. **Day 5: Fri, Apr 28** – MURORAN (HOKKAIDO), JAPAN. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 5:00 pm. This cozy city's economy has historically been driven by coal and iron, but behind its industrial facade you'll discover some of Japan's most compelling scenery. Ascend to the observatory at Cape Chikyu and survey Hokkaido's spectacular coastal landscape, or venture to serene Lake Toya, which is graced with views of soaring Mt. Yotei, an almost symmetrical volcano reminiscent of Mt. Fuji. Sample the region's distinctive cuisine with a

taste of curry ramen, a flavorful local twist on Japan's favorite casual noodle dish, and if you're a beer aficionado, a day trip to legendary Sapporo, a vibrant town that is home to Japan's oldest brewery, is a must. (B, L, D)

**Day 6: Sat, Apr 29** – AOMORI, JAPAN. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 5:00 pm. Each change of season brings fresh new beauty to the coastal city of Aomori. The blush of cherry blossoms greets you in spring, while in winter the forests of the surrounding mountains are so heavily laden with snow that the trees appear to be giant white beasts. The port is dominated by Aomori Bay Bridge, offering great views of both the city and the harbor and mirroring the striking triangular design of the Aomori Prefecture Tourist Center. The skyline's contemporary angles result from the city's destruction during WWII and rebuilding thereafter, but Aomori also celebrates ancient societies that settled here millennia ago. Surprisingly, you'll be reminded of this prehistoric past at the 21<sup>st</sup> century museum of modern art, as its architecture pays homage to the nearby excavations of ancient ruins. After exploring the museums and markets, relax at the caldera lakes and natural onsen hot springs in the lush countryside. (B, L, D)

**Day 13: Sat, May 06** – KODIAK, ALASKA. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 3:00 pm. The tiny village of Kodiak clings to the "Emerald Isle" of Kodiak, which is known for its breathtaking natural beauty. In summer the island is a mosaic of flora that includes wildflowers, moss-laden spruce, Pacific red elder, and blueberries, which the brown bears feast on. You may also spot puffins, red foxes, and killer whales. (B, L, D)

**Day 14: Sun, May 07** – ANCHORAGE (WHITTIER), ALASKA. Arrive 11:00 am. Depart 7:00 pm. With a population of only about 200, the small and quirky hamlet of Whittier is the gateway to beautiful Prince William Sound as well as Anchorage, which is only 60 miles away. Established as a secret military outpost during WWII, Whittier now attracts visitors for its unspoiled glaciers and wilderness. Glacier cruises along Prince William Sound make for a memorable afternoon – think sheer fjords, seaside mountains, and calving tidal glaciers. A picturesque train journey to Anchorage along the Alaska Railroad is another fantastic diversion; you'll enjoy awe-inspiring views of Turnagain Arm Fjord and Portage Valley. Chugach State Park is also nearby and excellent kayaking and hiking opportunities abound. (B, L, D)

**Day 15: Mon, May 08** – CRUISING HUBBARD GLACIER. From 3:00 pm to 5:00 pm.

**Day 16: Tue, May 09** – SITKA, ALASKA. Arrive 8:00 am. Depart 5:00 pm. Called "Shee Atika" by the Tlingit Indians, then "New Archangel" by the Russians who ousted them, Sitka boasts a multicultural heritage. Two dozen of its attractions are on the National Register of Historic Places, including Castle Hill and Building 29, a structure built by the Russians in 1835. The Sheldon Jackson Museum exhibits one of Alaska's oldest native culture collections. (B, L, D)

**Day 17: Wed, May 10** – KETCHIKAN, ALASKA. Arrive 8:00 am. Depart 2:00 pm. Totem poles are one of Ketchikan's chief attractions, and the best places to view them are Saxman Village and Totem Bight State Park. Drop by the Southeast Alaska Discovery Center to learn about the local cultures and ecosystems. (B, L, D)

**Day 18: Thur, May 11** – AT SEA. (B, L, D)

**Day 19: Fri, May 12** – VANCOUVER, BRITISH COLUMBIA, CANADA – DISEMBARK RIVIERA – HONOLULU. Disembark Riviera. Depart Vancouver. Return flight to Honolulu. Aloha and welcome home! (B)
