Day 1: Wednesday, March 22, 2028 Depart Honolulu - Overnight Flight You're on your way to South Africa, where incredible landscapes lead the way to cultural diversity, abundant wildlife, and remarkable history. From dynamic urban centers to wildlife safaris, Africa has a way of taking you by surprise.

Day 2: Thursday, March 23, 2028 Overnight Flight Continue your journey to Johannesburg

Day 3: Friday, March 24, 2028 Arrive Johannesburg, South Africa Your tour begins in Johannesburg, a dynamic city shaped by its gold-rush origins and modern role as South Africa's economic heart. As travelers' arrival times will vary, there are no scheduled activities today.

Day 4: Saturday, March 25, 2028 Johannesburg Enjoy time to get to know the place where your journey begins. Relax in your hotel before tomorrow's adventure begins. Dinner tonight is on your own. (B)

Day 5: Sunday, March 26, 2028 Johannesburg - Soweto Today, visit the Apartheid Museum to explore South Africa's journey from segregation to democracy. Continue to Soweto for a guided tour of one of the nation's most historic townships. Stop at a local market to experience daily life, noticing both the informal settlements and elegant homes that reflect the community's history and character. Drive past the former home of Nelson Mandela, an enduring symbol of the struggle for freedom. Then, join locals for lunch at a local *shabean* (pub), a gathering place deeply rooted in township culture. This evening, gather with your fellow travelers for a welcome dinner. (B, L, D)

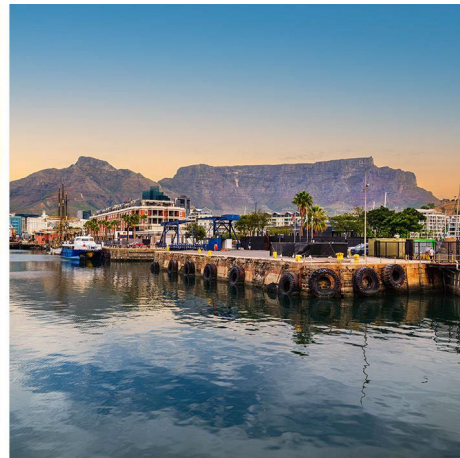
Day 6: Monday, March 27, 2028 Johannesburg - Kruger National Park Leave the city behind and start your adventure with a flight into the wild as you head to Kruger National Park, South Africa's largest game reserve. See how the landscape shifts dramatically, giving you a glimpse of the expansive savannas and diverse ecosystems that make Kruger so unique. Your lodge, positioned at the park's entrance, sets the stage for your safari experience. Tonight, gather with fellow travelers for your first dinner in the national park. (B, D)

Day 7: Tuesday, March 28, 2028 Kruger National Park Get your camera ready — today is all about the wildlife! Set out on a full-day game drive in an open-air vehicle, searching for Africa's iconic "Big Five." The safari bucket list of animals includes lions, leopards, rhinos, elephants, and cape buffalo. Pause midday for a picnic lunch, then continue your safari adventure into the afternoon. (B, L, D)

Day 8: Wednesday, March 29, 2028 Kruger National Park Embrace the rare opportunity to head back into the wild on another full-day safari game drive in Kruger National Park. Enjoy this second attempt to see any elusive animals you may have missed yesterday or get another look at your favorites. (B, L, D)

Day 9: Thursday, March 30, 2028 Kruger National Park After two immersive full-day safaris, today offers a slightly different rhythm in the bush. Head out on an early-morning game drive, taking advantage of the softer light and quieter atmosphere to observe familiar wildlife behaviors from a new angle. Return to the lodge for a hearty brunch and some well-earned downtime before venturing out again in the afternoon. Return after the sun sets for your final dinner in Kruger National Park. (B, L, D)

Day 10: Friday, March 31, 2028 Kruger National Park - Stellenbosch Say goodbye to the wild and hello to the winelands of the Western Cape. See for yourself why this area boasts a reputation as one of the world's most beautiful wine countries. Take a flight to Cape Town, South Africa and then a short drive to the town of Stellenbosch, located in South Africa's most famous wine region. Settle in for a 2-night stay among rolling vineyards and historic Cape Dutch architecture. (B)

Day 11: Saturday, April 1, 2028 Stellenbosch - Franschhoek Start your day with a walking tour of Stellenbosch, a university town known for its vineyards and mountainous nature reserves. Continue to nearby Franschhoek to experience the town's renowned wine culture with a cellar tour, tasting, and lunch before returning to Stellenbosch. Visit a second winery before returning back to your hotel for a relaxed evening. *(B, L)*

Day 12: Sunday, April 2, 2028 Stellenbosch - Cape Town Say hello to Cape Town, South Africa's electric cultural mecca that captivates you at every turn. Explore Victoria & Alfred Waterfront, a Cape Town hotspot. From heritage sites to historic landmarks, markets, shops, and restaurants, the waterfront is one of South Africa's most compelling destinations. On arrival, rise gently over the South African landscape in a cable car to Table Mountain,* taking in views of Cape Town, Lions Head, and historic Robben Island. Tonight, experience an evening of exciting African entertainment, music, food, and culture at a celebrated restaurant in the heart of the city. *(B, D)*

Day 13: Monday, April 3, 2028 Cape Town - Cape Peninsula Tour Travel to Cape Point, the southwestern tip of Africa. Marvel at the vibrant green foliage blanketing the rocky outcrops, set as a contrast to the bright blue waves below. Set out on a laid-back hike down the mountain, wandering by patches of native flowers. Then, stop at Boulders Beach for the rarest of black-tie events – a rendezvous with endangered African penguins! *(B)*

Day 14: Tuesday, April 4, 2028 Cape Town Immerse yourself in Cape Town's Bo-Kaap neighborhood, famous for its brightly painted houses and deep-rooted Cape Malay heritage. Meet your guide, who will take you to a local market where you'll pick up aromatic spices that set the stage for your Bo-Kaap cooking experience. Learn how to prepare Cape Malay staples, like delicate samosas and fragrant Cape Malay curry, before sitting to enjoy the delicious dishes you've created together. The remainder of the day is free to relax or explore at your leisure. *(B, L)*

Day 15: Wednesday, April 5, 2028 Cape Town Enjoy your final day at leisure before gathering with your fellow travelers for a farewell dinner to taste the country's beloved flavors, starring an array of South African specialties and delicacies. *(B, D)*

Day 16: Thursday, April 6, 2028 Cape Town - Tour Ends Your tour ends today, leaving you with memories of South Africa's incredible people and landscapes. *(B)*

Important Tour Information:

Book Now rates valid until July 31, 2026, valid on air inclusive packages only.

The overall activity level of this tour is a level 3. This means you're an on-the-go traveler. You don't want to miss a thing, so walking and standing for longer periods of time (2-3 hours) isn't a big deal. A moderately paced two-and-a-half-hour walking tour, covering several miles, hills, and uneven surfaces, is no problem for you. Walking four miles over the course of a day is very doable, as is climbing into and out of various modes of transportation (tuk-tuk, cable car, zodiac, etc.). You can climb three flights of stairs easily and handle altitudes between 6,000 and 9,000 feet. Expect some longer days with early mornings or late nights balanced with free time to recharge or set out on your own adventure. This level is not a fit for travelers who require mobility assistance devices.

Travel with an average of 19 people (maximum of 22).

To experience Africa fully, we recommend that all travelers be in reasonably good health and prepare properly.

This tour does not involve extensive walking. Be prepared for long days in safari vehicles over bumpy, dusty roads, with limited restroom access.

You will frequently need to climb in and out of safari vehicles throughout the tour.

This tour includes several early mornings, warm temperatures, and sitting for extended periods, sometimes up to 4 hours. This tour is not suitable for

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travelers who use mobility aids or have significant back, knee, or respiratory issues.

Unfortunately, wheelchairs cannot be accommodated on this tour. In addition, travelers who require assistance walking or who travel with oxygen tanks will not fully enjoy this trip, and we strongly recommend a different tour.

If you require any special assistance while on tour, please make us aware at the time of reservation so the necessary request form can be sent to your attention.

There are two internal flights on this tour. Schedule changes may impact the tour schedule and require early/late departures and reorganization of inclusions.

This tour includes three early-morning game drives with departures at 6:00 a.m.

Wildlife sightings cannot be guaranteed.

*Table Mountain Cableway is subject to weather conditions.

Single accommodations are extremely limited. Single rate subject to change based on availability. Triple accommodations are not available.

If you have dietary restrictions or food allergies, please notify us at the time of booking. While we do our best to accommodate requests, options may be limited and cannot be guaranteed.

Meals are prepared in shared kitchens, and we cannot guarantee they will be free from cross-contamination.

International travel may present challenges as menus reflect local tastes, and alternative diets may not be widely understood. Group meals typically feature pre-fixed menus designed to suit a variety of travelers.

To complete your tour, we include round-trip airport-to-hotel transfers when purchasing our airfare with your tour. If you have arranged for your own air, we are pleased to provide you the option of *purchasing* these transfers. Please note that all transfers will leave at pre-scheduled times.

If you've booked your own air, we kindly ask that you provide your full flight schedule. This helps us coordinate any additional services you may have purchased, such as hotel transfers, and ensures your Tour Manager knows when to expect your arrival. It also allows us to stay in touch in case of any emergencies.

For travelers transiting via Europe, an additional overnight flight will be required. Day rooms or overnight stays can be arranged for a cost upon request.

For air-inclusive reservations, the name provided at time of booking must match your government-issued ID that will be used during travel. Name changes are subject to penalties.

Internal flights are required in order to participate in this tour and are included in the final price, quoted at time of booking.

Park fees starting at approximately \$115 USD per person (subject to change without advance notice), quoted at time of booking, are payable at time of final payment.

Prepaid tipping is not available on our tours therefore payment of customary end-of-trip gratuities for your Tour Manager, driver, hotel housekeepers, and cruise ship waitstaff should be handled individually when applicable during the course of your tour.

Economy air rate and schedule are applicable for groups of 10 or more traveling on the same flights and dates.

Travel Requirements:

Passports are required for this tour at your expense. Certain countries require that your passport be valid at least 6 months beyond the dates of your travel. You are strongly urged to contact the appropriate consulate for details. Visit www.travel.state.gov for the U.S. State Department for the latest details about passports and visa requirements. IMPORTANT: We recommend that travelers take a photocopy of their passport and applicable visas. It should be packed separately from your actual passport and visa. We also recommend leaving a copy at home with your emergency contact.

IMPORTANT: If you are not a U.S. citizen, please check with your country's consulate or a trusted visa service to confirm the specific identification and documentation required for travel.

Important Passport Information: You must have at least 2 blank pages remaining in your passport to allow for the entry stamps issued for South Africa. The 2 pages for South Africa MUST be facing each other. Failure to comply with this law may result in denied boarding of your international flight. If you have questions, please see your travel professional or call us. Destination-specific information may change frequently and without prior notice. It is very important that you frequently check the entry/exit requirements for destination(s) visited on this tour, to ensure that you are aware of any changes that may be applicable to your travel plans, including right up to your departure. We will not be responsible for costs incurred for missed flights or canceled tours where a traveler fails to secure proper documentation.

If you are traveling with children under the age of 18, South Africa requires that those children must have proper documentation and/or consent when traveling into or out of the Republic. Please refer to www.dha.gov.za/index.php/statements-speeches/621-advisory-new-requirements-for-children-travelling-through-south-african-ports-of-entry-effective-1-june-2015 for the most up-to-date details on requirements. Please check directly with the airline for the legal documentation that is required. It is the sole responsibility of the traveler to procure the proper documentation to travel and many requirements vary by airline and destination.

Collette will provide all necessary information, updates, and supporting documents for your travel requirements, including visa and Electronic Travel Authorizations (ETAs), if required, approximately 60-90 days prior to your departure.

Foreign credit cards are generally accepted at hotels, shops, and restaurants. For tipping, US Dollars or South African Rand are acceptable, and we advise all our travelers to carry smaller denominations, as change is not always available.

Each traveler is responsible for proper documentation and inoculations that may be required and/or recommended to participate on this tour. Please contact your local travel clinic or personal physician for specific details on the destinations you are traveling to and from.

A deposit of \$698 per person is due upon reservation. Reservations are made on a first come, first served basis. Reservations made after the seat reduction date of July 31, 2026 are based upon availability. Final payment due by October 22, 2027. Deposits are refundable up until March 24, 2027.
