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**Day 1: Mon, Mar 16** – HONOLULU. Depart Honolulu via Japan Airlines flt #73 at 11:55 am.

**Day 2: Tue, Mar 17** – HANEDA – TOKYO. Arrive at the Haneda International Airport at 3:55 pm. After entry formalities, transfer by coach to your hotel in Tokyo. Enjoy a buffet dinner at the hotel. KEIO PLAZA HOTEL TOKYO (3 Nights) (D)

**Day 3: Wed, Mar 18** – TOKYO. After a sumptuous buffet breakfast, embark on a full day of discovery! First visit **Meiji Shrine**, the Shinto shrine dedicated to the deified spirits of the Emperor Meiji and his wife, Empress Shoken. Then visit the visually stimulating **Harajuku Shopping District**. Today's highlight will be a hands-on **sushi making session**, which will yield your delicious lunch. After lunch, head to **Asakusa**, the center of Tokyo's shitamachi (literally "low city") districts, where an atmosphere of the Tokyo of past decades survives. Asakusa's main attraction is **Sensoji**, a very popular Buddhist temple built in the 7<sup>th</sup> century. The temple is approached via the **Nakamise**, a shopping street that has been providing temple visitors with a variety of traditional local snacks and tourist souvenirs for centuries. Next visit **Ameyoko**, a busy market street along the Yamanote Line Tracks between Okachimachi and Ueno Stations. The name "Ameyoko" is a short form for "Ameya Yokocho" ("candy store alley"), as candies were traditionally sold there. Alternatively, "Ame" also stands for "America," because a lot of American products used to be available there when the streets was the site of a black market in the years following WWII. Today, various products such as clothes, bags, cosmetics, fresh fish, dried food, and spices are sold along Ameyoko. Then transfer back to the hotel. The evening is at your leisure. The Local Guide will have suggestions for nearby dining and shopping. (B, L)

**Day 4: Thur, Mar 19** – TOKYO. Day at leisure. Enjoy shopping and dining in the bustling Shinjuku area. Perfect day to relax and/or visit with family and friends in Tokyo. Your Local Guide will be available to assist as needed. (B)

\*Baggage will be sent from Tokyo to Kyoto, skipping Hakone. Prepare an overnight bag for one night.

**Day 5: Fri, Mar 20** – TOKYO – OSHINO – HAKONE. After breakfast, depart Tokyo for Hakone. Visit **Oshino Hakkai**, a set of eight ponds located in the Fuji Five Lake Region. The eight ponds are fed by melting snow from the nearby slopes of Mt. Fuji. The melted snow filtered down through porous layers of lava for 80 years, resulting in a very clear spring water that is revered by the locals. Next to one pond, visitors can drink the cool water straight from the source. Continue the journey to Hakone where much of the area is considered an active volcanic zone since its creation from eruption of Mt. Hakone some 3,000 years ago. After lunch, enjoy a **boat ride on the beautiful Lake Ashi**. Transfer to the hotel for a buffet dinner. The **onsen hot springs** – which are – which are divided for men and women –



allow you to enjoy the hot springs whether indoors or outdoors. The high-quality service and facilities are sure to become some of your fondest memories of your visit to Japan. HAKONE HOTEL KOWAKIEN (1 Night) (B, L, D)

**Day 6: Sat, Mar 21** – HAKONE – KYOTO. After breakfast, visit **Owakudani** ("Great Boiling Valley"), the source of the hot spring waters of Hakone. Then take in the view of the surrounding countryside from the **Hakone Ropeway**. Then transfer to Odawara Train Station where we will board a **Shinkansen Bullet Train** to Kyoto Station. Transfer to the hotel. After check-in, explore the many restaurants and shops conveniently located near your hotel. Remainder of the day is at your leisure. The Local Guide will have suggestions on various dining and shopping opportunities nearby. MIYAKO HOTEL KYOTO HACHIGO (2 Nights) (B)

**Day 7: Sun, Mar 22** – KYOTO. After a sumptuous Japanese/Western buffet breakfast at the hotel, embark on a full day of sightseeing beginning with a **traditional Japanese tea ceremony**. Next, visit **Kinkakuji Temple (Golden Pavilion)**, a Zen Temple whose top two floors are completely covered in gold leaf. After lunch, visit **Nijo Castle**. After the Tokugawa Shogunate fell in 1867, Nijo Castle was used as an imperial palace for a while before being donated to the city and opened up to the public as a historical site. Its place buildings are arguably the best surviving examples of castle palace architecture of Japan's feudal era. Today's hands-on experience is **Surikomi Yuzen (brush dyed Yuzen)**. Since the patterns are dyed by placing a paper stencil over a tote bag, you can make an authentic piece, even if this is your first time. A great reminder of this trip! Return to the hotel for a buffet dinner. (B, L, D)

**Day 8: Mon, Mar 23** – KYOTO – NARA – KANSAI – HONOLULU. After breakfast, visit **Sanjusangen-do**, the Buddhist temple famous for its 1,001 statues of Kannon, the goddess of compassion. Next visit the stunning vermilion colored **Fushimi Inari Shrine**, whose four kilometer long tunnel of scarlet torii gates was featured on the film *Memoirs of a Geisha*. After a buffet lunch, visit the **Todaiji Temple** in Nara. Todaiji, the largest wooden building in Japan, houses the largest bronze statue of Buddha at 16.3 meters high. The surrounding **Nara Deer Park** is inhabited by **over 1,000 deer**. Transfer to Kansai International Airport for our return flight home. Depart Osaka via Japan Airlines flt #792 at 10:10 pm and arrive in Honolulu at 10:25 am the same day. Aloha and welcome home! (B, L)
