Day 1: Sat, May 03 — HONOLULU. Depart Honolulu via Japan Airlines flt #791

Day 2: Sun, May 04 — KANSAI (OSAKA), JAPAN. Arrive at Kansai International Airport at 3:50 pm. After entry formalities, walk to hotel located within the airport. HOTEL NIKKO KANSAI AIRPORT (1 Night)

Day 3: Mon, May 05 - KANSAI (OSAKA) - KYOTO. After a delicious Japanese/ Western buffet breakfast at the hotel, embark on a full day of sightseeing beginning with a visit to Kinkakuji Temple (Golden Pavilion), a Zen temple whose top two floors are completely covered in gold leaf. Next we visit Nijo Castle. After the Tokugawa Shogunate fell in 1867, Nijo Castle was used as an imperial palace for a while before being donated to the city and opened up to the public as a historic site. Its palace buildings are arguably the best surviving examples of castle palace architecture of Japan's feudal era. Today's hands-on experience is surikomi yuzen (brush dyed yuzen). Since the patterns are dyed by placing a paper stencil over a table mat you can make an authentic piece, even if this is your first time. Arrive at the hotel in Kyoto. Evening is at your leisure. Your Tour Guide will have suggestions for dinner. MIYAKO HOTEL KYOTO HACHIJO (1 Night) (B, L)

Day 4: Tue, May 06 — KYOTO — NARA — OSAKA. After breakfast, check out from hotel. A full day of sightseeing is ahead. On our way to Osaka, experience a traditional Japanese tea ceremony. Visit Kiyomizu Temple (literally "Pure Water Temple"). View the stunning vermilion colored Fushimi Inari Shrine, whose four kilometers long tunnel of scarlet torii gates was featured on the film Memoirs of a Geisha. Next visit Todaiji Temple in Nara. Todaiji, the largest wooden building in Japan, houses the largest bronze statue of Buddha at 16.3 meters high. The surrounding Nara Park is inhabited by over 1,000 deer. Enjoy a kaiseki dinner at the hotel. HOTEL GRANVIA OSAKA (2 Nights) (B, L, D)

Day 5: Wed, May 07 — OSAKA. Start the day with a visit to Kuromon Ichiba Market, a lively covered market which stretches for 580 meters in Osaka's Chuo Ward. The market is famous for its fresh seafood, fruits and vegetables, meats, dried fish, pickles, and confectionery. Many stalls will prepare, cook, and serve their food to you right on the spot! An excellent place to stroll, sample, and snack on a delicious variety of fresh market foods. Next, visit Shinsaibashi **Shopping Arcade** and the surrounding area is Osaka's premier shopping center. Approximately 600 meters long, this area is unique as it combines chain retail stores and trendy boutiques with expensive department stores and top designer fashion labels. Dotonbori, one of Osaka's most popular tourist destinations, this street runs parallel to the Dotonbori canal. It is a popular shopping and entertainment district and is also known as a food destination. Enjoy lunch (on your own) here. A final shopping stop will be made at an AEON MALL before returning to the hotel. (B)

Day 6: Thur, May 08 - OSAKA - KOBE - EMBARK REGATTA. Depart Osaka for Kobe. Enjoy a kobe beef shabu shabu lunch, before transferring to the pier for embarkation on the Oceania Regatta. Overnight in Port. (B, L, D)

Day 8: Sat, May 10 — HIROSHIMA, JAPAN. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 4:00 pm. Visit the skeletal A-Bomb Dome, the Peace Memorial Park and Museum, and the statue dedicated to the children who died after the atomic bomb was dropped on this city in 1945. Stroll through beautifully landscaped Hiroshima Gardens,

visit the rebuilt Hiroshima Castle or journey to the exquisite sacred island of Miyajima and see the extraordinary Itsukushima Shrine. (B, L, D) Day 9: Sun, May 11 - BUSAN, SOUTH KOREA. Arrive 10:00 am. Depart

7:00 pm. From trendy cafes and famous fish markets to sacred temples and traditional tea ceremonies, Busan, the second largest city in South Korea is bursting with flavors and culture. Take a walk in the relaxing Yongdusan Park while admiring the various species of trees and a view of the Busan Tower. At the Hongbeopsa farming temple, explore the renowned large Buddha statues at the Main Buddha Hall while walking along a water lily path, or experience a traditional Korean tea ceremony conducted by one of their monks. (B, L, D)

Day 10: Mon, May 12 — CRUISING THE YELLOW SEA. (B, L, D)

Day 11: Tue, May 13 — SEOUL (INCHEON), SOUTH KOREA. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 6:00 pm. Travel to Seoul and discover its 5,000-year-old heritage amidst the ultra-modern high-rises. Visit the magnificent 14th century Gyeongbok Palace and stone pagoda, the National Museum and the bustling antique district. Or spend a day in the serene atmosphere of a Zen Buddhist temple and a historic Korean village. Tour the DMZ and rediscover the drama of recent history. Or simply wander the fish market and promenade at Inchon. (B, L, D)

Day 12: Wed, May 14 - JEJU, SOUTH KOREA. Arrive 1:00 pm. Depart 9:00 pm. Known as the "Island of the Gods," Jeju offers beautiful beaches as well as breathtaking views from Hallasan, the highest peak in South Korea. The volcanic island features one of the finest lava tube systems of caves in the world and has been named a UNESCO World Heritage Site for its dramatic landscapes of outstanding beauty. Walk the scenic path to the Cheonjiyeon Waterfall, one of the island's most famous attractions, and watch history and culture come alive at the open-air Jeju Folk Village Museum. (B, L, D)

Day 13: Thur, May 15 — NAGASAKI, JAPAN. Arrive 11:00 am. Depart 8:00 pm. Discover remnants of old Nagasaki beside the modern city. Visit the Peace Park and Atomic Bomb Museum. Or travel to Arita, home of magnificent Japanese ceramics, and tour famous Kakiemon Kiln, which continues a 400-year-old tradition. Experience feudal Japan and the natural wonders of Shimabara Peninsula with its volcanoes and hot springs. (B, L, D)

Day 14: Fri, May 16 – KAGOSHIMA, JAPAN. Arrive 9:00 am. Depart 7:00 pm. Visit the exquisite Iso-Teien Garden and its villa, built in 1660, and enjoy its gorgeous views before a short ferry ride to smoking Sakurajima for a close-up view of the volcano and its lava fields. Or journey into the countryside to Chiran and its wellpreserved streets lined with samurai homes. Enjoy the beautiful landscape of Lake Ikeda and the stunning vistas of the Satsuma Peninsula. (B, L, D)

Day 15: Sat, May 17 — BEPPU, JAPAN. Arrive 11:00 am. Depart 7:00 pm. Backed by steep hills and mountains on the eastern coast of Kyushu Island, Beppu is known as Japan's top hot spring resort city. Home to more than 2,000 hot springs, this picturesque city gives you a chance to experience its hot springs, mud baths, steam baths and even traditional Japanese black sand baths. To top it off, eight unique hot springs, collectively named Onsen Hells, offer entertainingly distinctive attractions. On chilly days, visitors are treated to the otherworldly view of steam rising throughout the city. Since Beppu is famously popular within Japan as a resort getaway, it's an ideal place to rub elbows with Japanese travelers. (B, L, D)

Day 16: Sun, May 18 — KOCHI, JAPAN. Arrive 7:00 am. Depart 4:00 pm. Not the typical Japanese city, small and compact Kochi has gained a well-deserved reputation for its exuberant, easy-going spirit and vibrant food scene. The city is the birthplace of the legendary samurai Sakamoto Ryoma, who created an alliance that eventually brought down the Tokugawa shogunate and is now commemorated in a memorial museum. In the city center, don't miss the well-preserved hilltop Kochi Castle to explore the grounds where the city was established in 1601. You might continue your downtown explorations at one of the many pedestrian shopping arcades or at a restaurant to try Kochi's most famous dish — katsuo-no-tataki, a savory dish of grilled, ponzu-marinated skipjack tuna or bonito fish. (B, L, D)

Day 17: Mon, May 19 - NAGOYA, JAPAN. Arrive 10:00 am. Depart 8:00 pm. A center of modern commerce, yet steeped in ancient history; visit the castle in the center of town, its golden orca statues are a symbol of the city. Explore Toyota's Museum of Technology and tour the Noritake factory, where bargains on the fine china can be found. (B, L, D)

Day 18: Tue, May 20 — SHIMIZU, JAPAN. Arrive 8:00 am. Depart 8:00 pm. In the shadow of Mount Fuji, Shimizu is one of the most beautiful ports in Japan. Walk through the pine groves of Miho, home to a 650-year-old Japanese black pine, or enjoy spectacular views of Mount Fuji from the lush, forested hill of Nihondaira. Take in the seascapes on a bay cruise, or learn of undersea delights at Japan's first sushi museum. For a historic angle, get a glimpse at feudal life in Japan in 200 BC at the archaeological site of Toro. (B. L. D)

Day 19: Wed, May 21 — TOKYO, JAPAN. Arrive 7:00 am. Overnight in Port. Dazzling cityscapes await your exploration; visit Asakusa for the bright lights, street fairs and Sensoji Temple; the Tsukiji Market, the largest open-air fish market in the world with on-the-spot sushi; and the Imperial Palace's East Garden for some calm. Spend the evening in the bright, active Ginza District, where the night comes alive. (B, L, D)

Day 20: Thur, May 22 — TOKYO — DISEMBARK REGATTA — HONOLULU. Disembark Regatta. Today's highlight will be a hands-on **sushi making** session, which will yield your delicious lunch. After lunch, visit Asakusa, the center of Tokyo's shitamachi (literally "low city"), one of Tokyo's districts, where an atmosphere of the Tokyo of past decades survives. Asakusa's main attraction is **Sensoji**, a very popular Buddhist temple built in the 7th century. The temple is approached via the Nakamise, a shopping street that has heen providing temple visitors with a variety of traditional local snacks and tourist souvenirs for centuries. Enjoy more shopping in **Ameyoko**, a busy market street along the Yamanote Line tracks between Okachimachi and Ueno Stations. The name "Amevoko" is a short form for "ameva vokocho" ("candystore alley"), as candies were traditionally sold there. Alternatively, "ame" also stands for "America," because a lot of American products used to be available there when the street was the site of a black market in the years following WWII. Today, various products such as clothes, bags, cosmetics, fresh fish, dried food, and spices are sold in Ameyoko. Transfer to the airport for the flight home. Depart Haneda International Airport via Japan Airlines flt #74 at 9:05 pm and arrive Honolulu at 9:35 am the same day. Aloha and welcome home! (R. I.)
