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2026 Hokkaido Snow Festival



Day 1: Fri, Jan 30 — HONOLULU. Depart Honolulu via Japan Airlines flt #71 at 3:45 pm.

Day 2: Sat, Jan 31 — HANEDA. Arrive at the Haneda International Airport at 8:10 pm. After entry formalities, walk to your hotel connected to the airport terminal. Enjoy dinner at the hotel. HOTEL VILLA FONTAINE GRAND HANEDA AIRPORT (1 Night) (D)

Day 3: Sun, Feb 01 — HANEDA — CHITOSE — TOKACHIGAWA. After a breakfast buffet at your hotel, walk back to the Haneda airport terminal. Depart Haneda Domestic Airport via Japan Airlines flt #511 at 10:20 am and arrive at the Chitose Domestic Airport at 11:55 am. Upon arrival in Chitose, depart the airport for Tokachigawa. En route, stop at a local restaurant for lunch. Upon arrival in Tokachigawa, check-in to the hotel. Enjoy time before dinner exploring the hotel, the seasonal fruits and sparkling wine at the **Premium Lounge** — available only for the guests staying at Hoshu-Tei — or **relax the private open-air moor onsen hot spring bath** in your room. Unlike the more common mineral onsens, the moor onsen is an alkaline botanical onsen that get its amber color from the organic plants deep underground. The amber waters moisturizes the skin and is known as “nature’s skin lotion.” Enjoy dinner at the hotel. After dinner, explore the **TOKACHIGAWA SWAN FESTIVAL**! TOKACHIGAWA ONSEN DAIICHI HOTEL HOSHU-TEI (2 Nights) (B, L, D)

Day 4: Mon, Feb 02 — TOKACHIGAWA — IKEDA — LAKE SHIKARIBETSU — TOKACHIGAWA. Enjoy breakfast, depart the hotel for Ikeda. En route, a brief stop will be made at **Ryugetsu Sweetpia Garden**, famous for their gift sets of cookies and pastries. Continue to Ikeda, where you will enjoy lunch and **learn about wine making** at the **Ikeda Wine Castle**. After lunch, travel to Lake Shikaribetsu. When winter arrives, the temperature drops dramatically around Lake Shikaribetsu, which is located at a high altitude. The lake is covered with ice 60 cm to 100 cm (23.5 to 39 inches) thick in the extreme cold, where temperatures below minus 30 degrees Celsius (-22 Fahrenheit) are not uncommon. On top of the ice, a phantom village called “**Lake Shikaribetsu Kotan**” appears. Kotan means “village” in the Ainu language. All the structures in the **LAKE SHIKARIBETSU WINTER FESTIVAL**! are made of ice and snow from the lake. The largest building in the village is the igloo, a series of “ice bars” and “ice halls”. It is surprisingly warm inside. When you take a breather and look around inside, you will be surprised to see that everything, even the pillars and tables, are made of ice. You can enjoy drinks in ice glasses made of ice at the ice bar. If your body cools down during your stay at Lake Shikaribetsu Kotan, warm up in the famous “open-air bath on ice. On days when the temperature difference between the outside temperature and the bathtub is close to 50 degrees Celsius (122 degrees Fahrenheit), you will feel numb in your hands and feet as you enter the hot water, but by the time it subsides, you will be in heaven to enjoy the open-air bath while looking out over a silver world. Moreover, the hot spring water is free-flowing from the source. The muddy brownish water, rich in iron, will warm your body from the core. The baths are co-ed during the daytime, and with swimsuits allowed (although not required). Alternatively, you can enjoy a mini spa or foot bath. Return to the hotel for dinner. (B, L, D)

Day 5: Tue, Feb 03 — TOKACHIGAWA — LAKE AKAN. After breakfast, depart Tokachigawa for Lake Akan. After lunch, stop at **Lake Akan Ainu Kotan**, one of the largest kotans (villages) in Hokkaido, and home to about 120 Ainu people. The Ainu people have coexisted with nature for centuries, and the Ainu history and culture



can be felt at the Ainu Theater Ikoro, a permanent theater where Ainu dance performances are held, and the art museum Onnechise, which houses beautiful artifacts. The Ainu history and culture that coexisted with nature can be felt at these facilities. The area is home to various facilities including craft shops, restaurants, an indoor theater dedicated to Ainu culture, museum, and a gallery with a collection of artwork. In Ainu culture, the number six is important; along with its numerical value it also means “many.” Kotan spreads the Ainu culture through the six senses — interacting, making, eating, inheriting, unleashing, and living with nature — based on the Ainu belief that souls reside in all things. Relax at the hotel before dinner. After dinner, walk to the nearby **LAKE AKAN WINTER FESTIVAL WITH FIREWORKS**! The completely frozen over lake offers you an unique event experience. Watch the “fuyu-hanabi” fireworks festival set on the ice. Warm up after the festival in your own **private onsen**. AKAN TSURUGA BESSOU HINANOZA (2 Night) (B, L, D)

Day 6: Wed, Feb 04 — LAKE AKAN. This morning experience **ice pond fishing for wakasagi (smelt fish)** on Lake Akan. Enjoy freshly made wakasagi tempura. After lunch, visit the **Akan International Crane Center**, the only facility in Japan dedicated to the research and protection of the red-crowned cranes (“tanchō” in Japanese). These culturally significant birds were saved from extinction in the 1950s by farmers in the Akan area who fed them crops through the harsh winters. These birds are believed to bring good luck. Even the indigenous people of Hokkaido said that they were marsh gods of the land. In the facility itself, check out the exhibitions which explain the cranes’ ecosystem. On the adjacent wetlands, be sure to watch these majestic birds outdoors under close-to-natural conditions. Between November and March, over 300 red-crowned cranes gather in the feeding area in front of the neighboring Tanchō Observation Center. Don’t miss the rare chance to see these stunning birds flying over the snow-covered landscape! Return to the hotel for dinner and an evening of leisure. (B, L, D)

Day 7: Thur, Feb 05 — LAKE AKAN — KITAMI — SOUNKYO. After breakfast, travel to **Watanabe Farm**, where you will **learn how to make ice cream** with fresh Hokkaido milk! After lunch, travel to Kitami. The production of mint in Kitami started around 1902, and reached its peak in 1939 when it produced about 70% of the world’s mint. The mild weather conditions in Kitami was ideal for growing and drying mint. The mint grown in Kitami is a unique Japanese variety known as hakka. This hakka, also known as Japanese mint, is the only one that contains menthol (as compared to western mint). Hakka is not only used in snacks, such as chewing gum and cookies, but is also renowned for its various medicinal properties. You will find the Kitami mint in cool gel patches, stomach medicine, and even eye drops and other ointments. Learn about the history of mint in Kitami at the **Kitami Mint Memorial Museum**. Adjacent to the Kitami Peppermint Museum stands the Mint Distillation House where you can enjoy the aroma of freshly made mint. Transfer to the hotel in Sounkyo. Take the time before dinner to explore the hotel or relax in your room. The **public onsens** — which are divided for men and women — allow you to enjoy the hot springs whether indoors or outdoors. The high-quality service and facilities are sure to become some of your fondest memories of your visit to Japan. HOTEL TAISETSU ONSEN & CANYON RESORT (2 Nights) (B, L, D)

Day 8: Fri, Feb 06 — SOUNKYO — ASHIKAWA — SOUNKYO. Before departing Sounkyo, visit the nearby **Ginga Ryusei Waterfall**. The word “ginga” means “the Milky Way” or “galaxy” and the word “ryusei” means “a meteor or shooting star.” After lunch, experience one of the most popular winter festivals in Hokkaido, the **ASHIKAWA WINTER FESTIVAL**! As Hokkaido’s second largest winter festival, after Sapporo’s Snow Festival, Asahikawa

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LAKE SHIKOTSU ICE FESTIVAL

Winter Festival boasts one of the biggest snow sculptures. Each year, one massive sculpture is made as a stage for music or other performances. The giant sculpture has a different theme each year. What will the theme be this year? Will it top the giant sculpture built in 1994 which made it into the book of Guinness World Records as the largest snow construction ever built? Return to Souunkyo for the **SOUNKYO ICE WATERFALL FESTIVAL**; a frozen world of ice featuring man-made ice caves, pillars, tunnels, domes, and sculptures. Return to the hotel for dinner. Warm up after dinner at the **hotel's onsen facilities**. (B, L, D)


Day 9: Sat, Feb 07 — SOUNKYO — ASHIKAWA — SAPPORO. After breakfast, depart the hotel. Begin the day with a visit to **Asahiya Zoo** to observe the **"Penguin Walk,"** in which the zoo's penguins walk along a 500 meter snow covered walkway, a way for the zoo to keep the birds fit during the winter months. While the penguins have a tendency to keep together as a group during these walks, sometimes some wander off course towards the crowd of visitors, and need to be "reminded" where they are going. Have your camera ready as these birds waddle pass you on their daily walk. Warm yourself with lunch (on your own) at the **Asahikawa Ramen Village**, where you'll get to choose the type of ramen lunch you'll have from one of eight ramen shops. Asahikawa is known for their shoyu based broths, while Sapporo is known for its miso based broths and Hakodate for its salt based broths. Which one will you try? After lunch, take a tour of the **Otokoyama Sake Brewery**, and taste some of their sake and other tasty products. On the way to Sapporo, stop at the **Sunagawa Highway Oasis**, a shopper's paradise. Enjoy dinner at the hotel. SAPPORO STREAM HOTEL (4 Nights) (B, D)

Day 10: Sun, Feb 08 — SAPPORO — LAKE SHIKOTSU — SAPPORO. Take in the wonders of the **SAPPORO SNOW FESTIVAL** at Odori Park and in the Susukino area. The Sapporo Snow Festival was started in 1950, when high school students built a few snow statues and it has since developed into a WORLD-CLASS EVENT attracting more than two million visitors. The Local Guide will spend the some time showcasing the highlights of the festival. For lunch, stop at a local **Wholesale Seafood Market** where an abundance of fresh seafood and the freshest local products can be found. While there, **pick out "LIVE" crabs** from the tanks, to enjoy with a special kaisen don lunch (fresh seafood over rice). After lunch, travel to Lake Shikotsu for the **LAKE SHIKOTSU ICE FESTIVAL**; a fantastic world of ice featuring various snow and ice sculptures created from the water of the nearby lake. Return to Sapporo. The remainder of the evening is free to explore more of Sapporo on your own. Don't miss out on the seeing the festival at night, when some of the sculptures are illuminated with lights. (B, L)

Day 11: Mon, Feb 09 — SAPPORO — ISHIKARI — OTARU — SAPPORO. After breakfast, begin the day with a tour of the new **ROYCE' Cacao and Chocolate Town** to learn how the famous ROYCE' chocolate treats are made. Receive a complimentary sample at the end of the tour. En route to Otaru, stop for lunch. Upon arrival in Otaru, take a stroll along the **Otaru Canal**. Next, stop at the **Otaru Music Box Museum**. A visit to the **Kitaichi Glass Company** will delight your eyes with beautiful creations. Return to Sapporo for an evening of leisure. (B, L)

Day 12: Tue, Feb 10 — SAPPORO. Day of leisure. The perfect opportunity to explore more of the **SAPPORO SNOW FESTIVAL** on your own. Don't forget the shopping opportunities at Susukino shopping area, or the Tanuki Koji Shopping Arcade, the largest and oldest shopping arcade in Sapporo, which houses over 200 shops. (B)



Day 13: Wed, Feb 11 — SAPPORO — CHITOSE — HANEDA — TOKYO. After breakfast, depart for the Chitose Airport. Depart the Chitose Domestic Airport via Japan Airlines flt #508 at 11:35 am and arrive at the Haneda Domestic Airport at 1:20 pm. Upon arrival in Haneda, depart for the hotel in Tokyo. Enjoy time before dinner exploring the hotel and its surroundings. HOTEL GRAND NIKKO TOKYO DAIBA (3 Nights) (B, D)

Day 14: Thur, Feb 12 — TOKYO. After breakfast, experience the **PLUM BLOSSOM FESTIVAL** at **Yushima Tenjin**, a shrine that's been known as a spot for plum blossom viewing for hundreds of years. The shinto shrine is home to about 300 plum trees, and most of them are around 70 to 80 years old. Approximately 80 percent of them are of the Shirakaga variety and produce white plum blossoms. 2026 will mark the 69th year of this festival, which is one of Tokyo's most popular late-winter events. Yushima Tenjin is also a popular spot for students wishing to pass exams, because Sugawara no Michizane — an ancient scholar who became revered as the Shinto deity of learning — is enshrined here. In the afternoon, take in the view of the surrounding city from the observation deck of the **Tokyo Skytree**. At just over 2,000 feet tall, it is the tallest tower in Tokyo. Rising 350 meters above the ground, the Tokyo Skytree Tembo Deck offers a 360 degree panoramic view of Tokyo. You'll have free time to enjoy lunch (on your own) at Tokyo Skytree, or at **Tokyo Solamachi**, the large shopping, dining, and entertainment complex at the base of the Tokyo Skytree. After lunch, enjoy free time in **Ginza**, Tokyo's renowned luxury shopping district, offering a mix of international brands, Japanese designers, and historic department stores. Ginza is home to flagship stores of global fashion leaders like Fendi, Saint Laurent, and Vivienne Westwood. Historic department stores, like Mitsukoshi and Matsuya offer a uniquely Japanese shopping experience. The first Apple store in Japan is also located here. Its main street houses some of Tokyo's original department stores, and many still flock here for peerless service that matches the high-class products on offer. For dinner, dine at a Wagyu Steakhouse before returning to the hotel for the evening. (B, D)

Day 15: Fri, Feb 13 — TOKYO. Day at leisure. Enjoy the various shopping and dining available near the hotel. Your Local Guide will be available to assist as needed. Perfect day to relax and/or visit with family and friends in Tokyo. (B)

Day 16: Sat, Feb 14 — TOKYO — HANEDA — HONOLULU. Begin the day exploring **Toyosu Senkyaku Banrai**, a shopping complex that recreates an Edo period neighborhood. Toyosu Senkyaku Banrai offers fresh food from the neighboring Toyosu Market and serves to showcase the best foods in Tokyo. Enjoy time for shopping. If you get tired, head up to the 8th floor and relax at the foot bath garden — which is free of charge to all visitors. Today's highlight will be a hands-on **sushi making session**, which will yield your delicious lunch. Lastly visit **Ameyoko**, a busy market street along the Yamanote Line tracks between Okachimachi and Ueno Stations. The name "Ameyoko" is a short form for "Ameya Yokocho" ("candy store alley"), as candies were traditionally sold there. Alternatively, "Ame" also stands for "America," because a lot of American products used to be available there when the street was the site of a black market in the years following WWII. Today, various products such as clothes, bags, cosmetics, fresh fish, dried food, and spices are sold along Ameyoko. Transfer to the Haneda Airport for the flight home. Depart Haneda International Airport via Japan Airlines flt #74 at 9:00 pm and arrive Honolulu at 8:45 am the same day. Aloha and welcome home! (B, L)

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


HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS:



HANEDA AIRPORT — HOTEL VILLA FONTAINE GRAND HANEDA AIRPORT (1 NIGHT):

The hotel is conveniently located just a one minute walk from Terminal 3. Japan is one of the world's leading onsen hot spring countries, and have long been loved by the Japanese for their ability to prevent disease, promote health,

bestow beauty and anti-aging benefits, and soothe the body and mind. Shake the weariness of the 9½ hour flight as you relax in the onsen (for the nominal fee of 2,000 yen). Or get an introduction to Japanese convenience stores at Lawson (open 24 hours) on the 2nd floor.



TOKACHIGAWA — TOKACHIGAWA ONSEN DAIICHI HOTEL HOSHU-TEI (2 NIGHTS):

After check-in, relax in the Premium Lounge – available only for guests booked in one of the 24 exclusive Hoshu-Tei rooms – where you'll be greeted with seasonal fruits and sparkling wine. Each of the 24 Hoshu-Tei rooms have a private

open-air Moor Onsen bath, with beautiful views of the Tokachi River and Hidaka mountain range. Feel the warmth from the fireplace as it permeates the room. Or enjoy the open-air onsen located by the garden – where you can listen to the sounds of a waterfall – as you relax in its waters.



LAKE AKAN — AKAN TSURUGA BESSOU HINANOZA (2 NIGHTS):

To help every guest relax and enjoy a soothing bath without reservations, every room features its own outdoor private onsen bath to enjoy at any time of day, in any season. Enjoy the luxury of your own private onsen to your heart's content. In addition to the

open-air bath in your room, there are two large public baths (one indoor and one outdoor overlooking the shores of Lake Akan) and hot stone saunas. Select drinks, including draft or bottled beer, "sour" sodas, soft drinks, liqueur, sake, shochu, sparkling wine, and red and white wine are complimentary.



SOUNKYO — HOTEL TAISETSU ONSEN & CANYON RESORT (2 NIGHTS):

The hotel opened in 1954 – recently celebrating its 70th anniversary – and aims to continue to coexist with the natural beauty of Mt. Taisetsu and Sounkyo. Located on the highest hill in Sounkyo, it's the only hotel in Hokkaido with three grand baths and two open-air baths that flow directly from the source.



SAPPORO — SAPPORO STREAM HOTEL (4 NIGHTS):

This new hotel opened in January 2024. You will have access to the Premium Lounge – which is the exclusive space for guests staying in Premium Comfort rooms – where snacks, soft drinks and alcohol beverages with a local feel and breakfast menu with chef's recommendations featuring ingredients from Hokkaido will be served. In addition, the spa and sauna are exclusively for Premium category room guests. A different kind of

healing can be experienced by taking a bath or sauna, with a view that shows a different side depending on the time of day. Löyly (pouring water on hot stones) is available in the Finnish sauna, which is filled with the aroma of cedarwood. Explore the shopping complex, making up the lower six floors of the hotel (B2F–4F) or access the Susukino Subway Station in your free time.



TOKYO — HOTEL GRAND NIKKO TOKYO DAIBA (3 NIGHTS):

Beyond the Rainbow Bridge is another world away from everyday life. A private lounge exclusively for guests on the Executive Floor, are catered to by the dedicated staff. The Japanese convenience store, Lawson (open 24 hours), is located on the 2nd floor of the Atrium Building. Located just a three-minute walk from the hotel, Aquacity is a shopping mall featuring various stores, boutiques, restaurants, cafés and a cinema complex. The 5th floor houses a ramen theme park where you can try different ramen from all over Japan. There are nice views of the Rainbow Bridge from the wooden deck in front of Aquacity and the neighboring Decks. Decks is a shopping mall featuring shops, restaurants and multiple indoor theme parks, including Tokyo Joypolis, LEGOLAND Discovery Center, a Madame Tussauds Wax Museum, and a trick art museum. And just five-minutes away, DiverCity Tokyo Plaza is a shopping, dining and entertainment complex that opened in 2012 and features attractions related to the Gundam anime series, including a large, "life-size" Gundam statue in front of the building and Gundam Base Tokyo, a shop dedicated to plastic models. The latest scientific technology that Japan has to offer at the National Museum of Emerging Science and Innovation, just 15 minutes from the hotel.
