2026 Cherry Blossoms Gourmet Onsen



Day 1: Wed, Mar 18 – HONOLULU. Depart Honolulu via Japan Airlines flt #791 at 11:25 am.

Day 2: Thur, Mar 19 – KANSAI. Arrive at the Kansai International Airport at 3:55 pm. Walk to your hotel which is a short covered walk from the airport. Dinner has been arranged at the hotel. HOTEL NIKKO KANSAI AIRPORT (1 Night) (D)

*Baggage will be sent from Kansai to Tamatsukuri, skipping Miyajima. Prepare an overnight bag for three nights.

Day 3: Fri, Mar 20 – KANSAI – HIROSHIMA – MIYAJIMA. After breakfast, transfer to Shin-Osaka Train Station by chartered bus. Transfer to Hiroshima Station by **Shinkansen Bullet Train** with **reserved seating** in the **Green Car**. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant upon arrival in Hiroshima. After lunch, start a full day of sightseeing by chartered bus. Visit the **A-Bomb Dome, Peace Memorial Park, Peace Memorial Museum**, and the **Peace Bell**. After a short **ferry ride** arrive on the island of Miyajima, considered sacred by many. This evening soak in the relaxing atmosphere of Iwaso Inn and the **onsen hot spring baths**. You can enjoy the beauty of the primeval forests and gentle sound of mountain streams while taking a bath. This evening enjoy a traditional, multi-course **Kaiseki Dinner** featuring Hiroshima's local and seasonal ingredients including fresh seafood from the Seto Inland Sea. IWASO INN (3 Nights) (B, L, D)

Day 4: Sat, Mar 21 – MIYAJIMA. After breakfast, walk to the nearby vermilion torii gate of **Itsukushima Shrine**, which at high tide, looks like it's floating in the middle of the sea. The shrine complex has been selected as one of Japan's three most scenic places (nihon sankei). **Learn how to make momiji manju**, a specialty of the area. Free time will be given to explore the excellent **shopping** opportunities available down the main street of Miyajima Island and enjoy lunch (on your own). After lunch, take in the view from the **Miyajima Ropeway** – the cable car and gondola system linking Miyajima township to Mt. Misen. On a clear day the ropeway provides an excellent observation point, plus access to the Wild Monkey Park, temples, and shrines. Return to the hotel for a different variety of **Kaiseki Dinner**. Be sure to enjoy the **onsen hot spring baths** before and after your dinner. (B, D)

Day 5: Sun, Mar 22 – MIYAJIMA. Begin the day with some hands-on activities, including **dressing up in a kimono** and experiencing a **tea ceremony**, and learning how to **write**



in calligraphy. The remainder of the day is at your leisure to explore more of Miyajima on your own. Don't forget to try the plump steamed oysters that Miyajima is known for. And make friends with the wild deer that continue to roam freely around Miyajima. (B)

Day 6: Mon, Mar 23 – MIYAJIMA – IZUMO – TAMATSUKURI. After breakfast, we make our way back to Honshu via a short **ferry ride**. Enroute to Tamatsukuri, a stop will be made at a **Michi-no-Eki** (a roadside station) for lunch on your own. Then take a tour of the **Tatara Sword Factory**, where you will learn how traditional tatara swords are made. Tatara is the technique used in Japan to produce the pure steel needed to make Japanese swords. The traditional materials used are iron, sand, and coal – which are still used today. This evening enjoy a special **Kaiseki Dinner** at your hotel. Dinner will be accompanied by an **Iwami Kagura Show** – an unforgettable kind of masked traditional performance. The stories told in these performances are usually drawn from ancient history books dating from the 8th century, or from legends and stories of monsters made famous in Noh theater. The stories are easy to follow as they often consist of heroes and villains, gods and demons, of good guys and bad guys. Many times, these dances involve intense choreographed sword-fights. However, it's not all action and drama as there are comedic interludes with some dances that approach pantomime. These interludes are sure to have you laughing and cheering. After dinner, don't forget to try the **onsen hot springs** facilities. HOTEL GYOKUSEN (2 Nights) (B, D)

Day 7: Tue, Mar 24 – TAMATSUKURI – MATSUE – TAMATSUKURI. Begin the day at **Izumo-Taisha** located near the Sea of Japan. It is one of Japan's most important shrines. Izumo used to be ruled by a powerful clan in pre-historic times, and the region plays a central role in Japan's creation mythology. The main kami (deity) enshrined at Izumo-Taisha is Okuninushi no Okami. According to the creation myths, Okuninushi was the creator of the land of Japan and the ruler of Izumo. He also became known as the deity of good relationships and marriage. Visitors consequently clap their hands four times instead of the usual two times during their prayers: twice for themselves and twice for their actual or desired partners. After lunch, take a **boat cruise on the Hori River**, before visiting the quaint **Matsue Castle**. Then enjoy some free time for shopping and dining (on your own) at an **AEON MALL** before returning to the hotel for an evening of leisure. (B, L)

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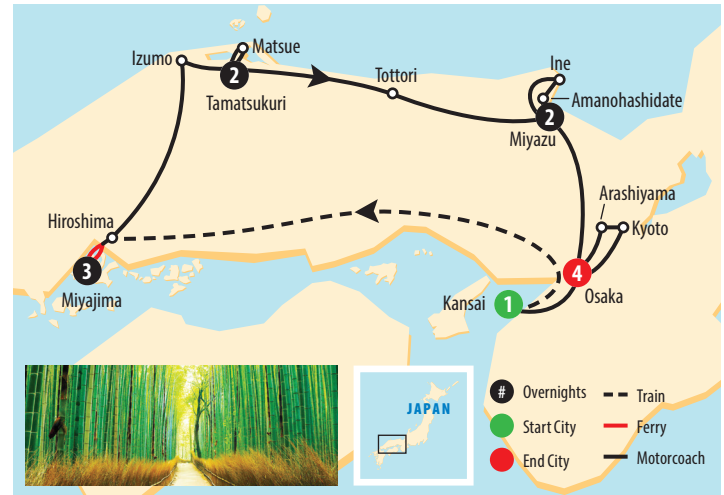


Day 8: Wed, Mar 25 – TAMATSUKURI – TOTTORI – MIYAZU. After breakfast, explore the **Adachi Museum of Art**. Founded by Adachi Zenko in 1980 as a way of combining his passions for Japanese art and garden design. He hoped that viewing the gardens and artwork together would expand peoples' appreciation and interest in Japanese art. The Adachi Museum of Art is best known for its award winning garden. It has been named the best garden in Japan annually since 2003 by the *Journal of Japanese Gardening*. The garden can be enjoyed at any time of the year and shows a different character depending on the season. It can only be viewed from the museum building. In addition to the gardens, the Adachi Museum of Art also houses a collection of nearly 1,300 twentieth century paintings and artworks which are rotated seasonally. There is also a permanent exhibit of paintings by Yokoyama Taikan, as well as a ceramics exhibit. After lunch, witness the awesome **Tottori Sand Dunes** on our way to Miyazu. Enjoy a rejuvenating soak in the **onsen hot springs** before or after your buffet dinner at the hotel. **MERCURE KYOTO MIYAZU RESORT & SPA (2 Nights)** (B, L, D)

Day 9: Thur, Mar 26 – MIYAZU – INE – AMANOHASHIDATE – MIYAZU. First stop today is at the **Bay of Ine**. The small village is unique, consisting of 230 funaya (over water houses). After lunch, visit **Amanohashidate**, one of the three most scenic places in Japan along with Matsushima Bay near Sendai and Miyajima Island. The coast line is a long sandbar. You'll get a chance to **ride the cable car** and visit the **Kasamatsu Park Observatory**. Return to the hotel for dinner. (B, L, D)

Day 10: Fri, Mar 27 – MIYAZU – OSAKA. After breakfast, depart for Osaka. Enroute, stop at an **AEON MALL**, where you will have leisure time for shopping and dining (on your own). Upon arrival at the hotel in Osaka, the remainder of the day is at your leisure. Your hotel is directly connected to the JR Osaka Station – allowing convenient access to numerous shopping and dining opportunities. Your Local Guide will be available to assist as needed. **OSAKA STATION HOTEL (4 Nights)** (B)

Day 11: Sat, Mar 28 – OSAKA – ARASHIYAMA – KYOTO – OSAKA. After breakfast, transfer to Arashiyama. Enjoy free time in Arashiyama, where you may choose to explore the famous Arashiyama Bamboo Forests, or shop for world-famous Arashiyama bamboo products. Take a **ride on a rickshaw** around Arashiyama. Today's hands-on experience is **surikomi yuzen (brush dyed yuzen)**, which is one of Kyoto's traditional craft "Kyo-Yuzen dyeing" techniques.



Since the patterns are dyed by placing a paper stencil over a piece of fabric, such as a tote bag you can make an authentic piece, even if this is your first time. Your very own original work will be a perfect memento for yourself or a gift for someone else. Return to the hotel for some leisure time before enjoying a buffet dinner at the hotel. (B, L, D)

Day 12: Sun, Mar 29 – OSAKA. Full day at leisure. Your hotel connected to the JR Osaka Station – allowing easy access to Japan's convenient train system if you decide to explore more of Osaka's neighboring towns on your own today. It's also a perfect day to fulfill your shopping list at the numerous shops located in the train station. Your Local Guide will be available to assist as needed. (B)

Day 13: Mon, Mar 30 – OSAKA. Today will be dedicated to cherry blossom viewing. Begin at **Osaka Castle**, which has over 4,000 cherry trees scattered across its 261 acres. During peak cherry blossom season, you'll be treated to an expansive cloud of soft pink blossoms blooms from the Somei Yoshino variety of cherry trees, which make up the majority of trees here. After lunch, take a **river cruise on the Okawa River** and view the numerous cherry trees growing along the river bank. Then explore the **Expo 70 Commemorative Park**, the former site of the 1970 World Exhibition, which was turned into a large public park with over 5,000 cherry trees planted along its paths and around its large lawn areas. Return to the hotel for an evening of leisure. (B, L)

Day 14: Tue, Mar 31 – OSAKA – KANSAI – HONOLULU. The last day in Japan is all about shopping! After breakfast, begin the day at **Dotonbori**, one of Osaka's most popular tourist destinations. This street runs parallel to the Dotonbori Canal, and is a popular shopping and entertainment district -- known as a food destination. **Shinsaibashi Shopping Arcade** and the surrounding area is Osaka's premier shopping center. Approximately 600 meters long, this area is unique as it combines chain retail stores and trendy boutiques with expensive department stores and top designer fashion labels. Hope you didn't forget your Costco card! As the final stop after lunch, will be at **Costco**, before transferring to the Kansai International Airport for the return flight home. Depart Kansai Airport via Japan Airlines flt #792 at 10:10 pm and arrive in Honolulu at 10:45 am the same day. Aloha and welcome home! (B, L)

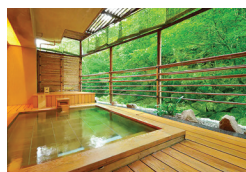

KANSAI — HOTEL NIKKO KANSAI

AIRPORT (1 NIGHT): The hotel is directly connected to Kansai International Airport – allowing guests to immediately begin relaxing after their flight.



MIYAJIMA — IWASO INN (3 NIGHTS):

Located on the World Heritage Miyajima Island, Iwaso Inn features Japanese-style accommodations with beautiful surrounding views. Guests can relax in the indoor and outdoor hot-spring baths. Traditional multi-course Kaiseki Dinners featuring seafood and local ingredients are served at the dining room. A Japanese or Western breakfast is served at Momiji restaurant. 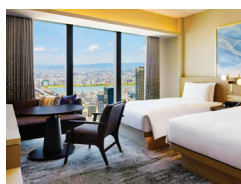
TAMATSUKURI — HOTEL GYOKUSEN

(2 NIGHTS): Tamatsukuri Onsen is one of the premier onsen resorts in Shimane, widely known for its beautifying effects on skin. Eighteen hotels and Japanese-style ryokan inns are built along both sides of the Tamayu River. Some of them offer a day spa; and public foot spas can also be enjoyed free of charge. The area also has spiritual locations, high-quality souvenir shops, and cafes for visitors. Rejuvenate in Hotel Gyokusen's lobby lounge, overlooking a traditional Japanese garden, bringing out the best in the natural beauty of the pine trees and the rock garden.



MIYAZU — MERCURE KYOTO MIYAZU

RESORT & SPA (2 NIGHTS): Immerse yourself in an all-inclusive stay at Mercure. The all-inclusive plan includes dinner, breakfast, drinks and snacks at the lounges, access to the onsen hot springs (public bathing facilities), and activities within the hotel. Free-flowing alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverages are included at dinner. From 3:00 pm to 6:00 pm daily, unwind in the lounge, where a selection of sparkling wine, beer, as well as soft drinks, coffee, black tea, and herbal waters are available complimentary. From 9:00 pm to 11:00 pm daily, conclude your day with a nightcap at the lounge, where you can enjoy a wide range of beverages, including whisky, brandy, and Japanese spirits, in a cozy yet refined ambiance.



OSAKA — OSAKA STATION HOTEL (4 NIGHTS):

Built on the historic grounds of Osaka's first train station, the Osaka Station Hotel opened its doors in July 2024. The hotel is directly connected to the current JR Osaka Station — allowing convenient access to numerous shopping and dining opportunities. It's also in the same building as the new Kitta Osaka shopping mall, with its Japan-centric basement restaurants and stores selling specialty goods from far-flung prefectures. Special arrangements have been made for rooms in the "Specialty" category at the hotel — allowing tour members special access to the Specialty Salon — a special space located on the 38th floor, offering food and drink services throughout the day, including breakfast, afternoon tea, and evening cocktails, as well as check-in and check-out services, along with access to the ofuro (Japanese bath) facilities on the 30th floor.



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
